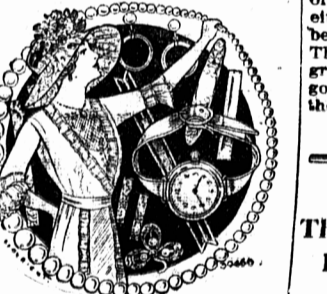

## Practical Hints in Care of Horses

For the treatment of horses while in the stable the following regulations are suggested:

1. The best order of feeding is: Water, hay, water again, grain.
2. Never give grain to a tired horse. Let him rest and nibble hay for an hour or two first.
3. Water the horses as often as possible; but let the horse that comes in hot drink a few swallows only.
4. Always water the horse after he has eaten his hay at night. This is important not only for his comfort, but for his health.
5. Do not forget to salt the horse once a week; or, better yet, keep salt always before him.
6. Give a bran mash Saturday night or Sunday noon; and on Wednesday night also, if work is slack. After a long day in very cold or wet weather a hot bran mash, half bran and half oats, with a tablespoonful of ginger, will do the horse good.
7. Keep a good, deep, dry bed under the horse while he is in the stable, day or night, on Sundays especially. The more he lies down, the longer his legs and feet will last.
8. In order to do well the horse must be kept warm. Give him a blanket on cool nights in late summer or early fall, and an extra blanket on an extra cold night in winter.
9. In cold rains do not tie up the horse's tail. The long tail prevents the water from running down the inside of his legs.
10. Take off the harness, collar and all, when the horse comes in to feed. He will rest better without it.
11. Never put a horse up dirty or muddy for the night. At least brush his legs and belly, and straighten his hair.
12. In hot weather, and in all weathers if the horse is hot, sponge his eyes, nose, dock, the harness marks, and the inside of his hind-quarters when he first comes in.
13. When the horse comes in wet with rain, first scrape him, then blanket him, and rub his head, neck, loins and legs. If the weather is cold put on an extra blanket in 20 minutes. Change the wet blanket when the horse dries. Do not wash the legs. Rub them dry, or bandage loosely with thick bandages. It is far more important to have the legs warm and dry than clean.
14. Examine the horse's feet when he comes in and wash them if he does not wear pads. If a horse in the city is not shod in front with pads, tar and oakum, which is the best way, it is absolutely necessary to keep his feet soft by packing them or by wrapping a wet piece of old blanket or carpet around the foot, or by applying some hoof dressing. Inside and out, at least three times a week.
15. Speak gently to the horse, and do not yell at him. He is a gentleman by instinct, and should be treated as such. The stable is the horse's home, and it is your privilege to make it a happy one.

While city and country conditions are widely different, the proper care of a good horse is practically the same either in the city or on the farm, this being especially true of draft horses. These suggestions are, therefore, of great value to those farmers who love good horses and are anxious to give them the care they deserve.

## MOTOR TRUCK'S FOR CITY SERVICE

While much has been heard of the efficiency and economy of motor trucks in City service, and, in the larger centres, in transportation service through suburban sections, little attention has been given to the truly wonderful work, which is being done by some motor trucks operating under entirely different conditions.

The comment often heard is, that a motor truck might do alright in some places, but in the remote sections the only kind of transportation that could successfully carry on the work, was that done by horses.

Now the motor truck is proving infinitely superior to horses in territories where steep mountain grades and roads that are practically no roads at all are the rule.

A notable example of this is the excellent service being obtained in mining sections of Arizona from motor trucks.

C. B. Rose, Chief Engineer of the Elie Motor Vehicle Co., and the Velle Engineering Company, manufacturers of the Velle truck, has just returned from an extended trip through the mining section of Arizona in the interests of his company, which practically monopolizes motor truck transportation in this territory.

Mr. Rose reports that the most remarkable example of truck efficiency that he has ever seen is displayed by the five Velle trucks now making the 85 mile trip from Silver City, Arizona to Mogollon.

This trip is one which might be considered impossible for any kind of a motor driven vehicle. Yet the Velle trucks are covering the 170 mile round trip in 27 hours.

This same trip previously required teams of 16 horses, 11 days.

An idea of the difficulty of the trip can be gained from the fact that the sun in Mogollon only shines from 11 o'clock in the morning to 1 in the afternoon due to the great height of the mountains on each side.

During the trip the Gila River had to be forded, and in the Mogollon mountains one five mile hill averages 9 per cent. grade for the distance of five miles and then drops 1200 feet in one mile.

During his trip through Arizona Mr. Rose was instrumental in closing a contract with the City of Tucson for the first motor driven fire wagon ever used in the state of Arizona.

"Probably one of the most picturesque sights to be seen at any factory is the mud bespattered Velle drivers returning from their work at this time of the year," says Mr. local Velle dealer, who has just come into the factory.

The course laid out for these test trials is over what is popularly called the oval.

It is a long route out through the country roads of Illinois, which in the early spring are always deep in mud.
