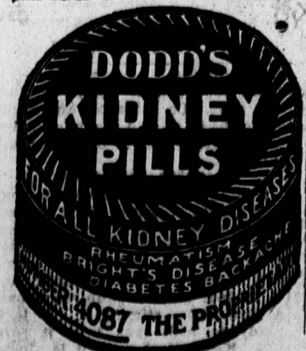

Noted Shipping Line To Abandon Canadian Service

MONTREAL, Dec. 14.—The Hamburg-American Line is abandoning its Canadian service, consisting of call at Halifax, N. S., and their Montreal office is being closed, it was seated here tonight and confirmed by wire from New York headquarters. Advice from the latter city were to the effect that insufficient passenger traffic was responsible for the decision. Boston will be the terminus of the service which has hitherto been operated to Halifax. The Montreal office of the Hamburg-American Line was opened in the spring of last year.
