## GOSPEL IN MANY TONGUES

LONDON, Sept. 13.—The British and Foreign Bible Society will publish very shortly a new edition of "The Gospel in Many Tongues." The last edition, which was published in 1912, had 432 specimens of tongues. This edition has 543. For the specimen of each tongue a verse has been chosen from the Gospel according to St. John, "God so loved the world," etc.

One hundred and thirty-five of these 543 languages have a complete Bible; 126 have a complete New Testament; and in the rest there is in each case one complete book, usually a Gospel. In some cases languages in which in earlier years the Scriptures were printed have fallen into disuse. The Bible, for example, which was prepared by John Elliot and printed for the Indians in Massachusetts has no longer any readers. On the other hand some other languages are constantly being added. About seven-tenths of the peoples of mankind have now got some portion of the Word of God in their own language. Missionaries are always bringing to the society translations in new languages.

The new "Gospel in Many Tongues" will contain specimens of more than sixty forms of characters—idiograms of China, ancient alphabets of Syria and India, Gothic and Slavonic letters, and occasionally special scripts which have been invented for the purpose of sending forth as simply as possible the message of the Word of God. Amongst the invented scripts are those for the Cree Indians, and certain aboriginal tribes of South-west China. Most of the African languages use the ordinary Roman script.

The Book will be very interesting to linguists and philologists for comparing different languages.

## REINDEER FOR BAFFIN LAND

Herd of 700 Purchased in Fimmark by Hudson Bay Concern.

CHRISTIANIA, Sept. 13.—A representative of the Hudson Bay Company recently paid a visit to Fimmark and bought a herd of 700 reindeer, which are to be shipped to Baffin Land.

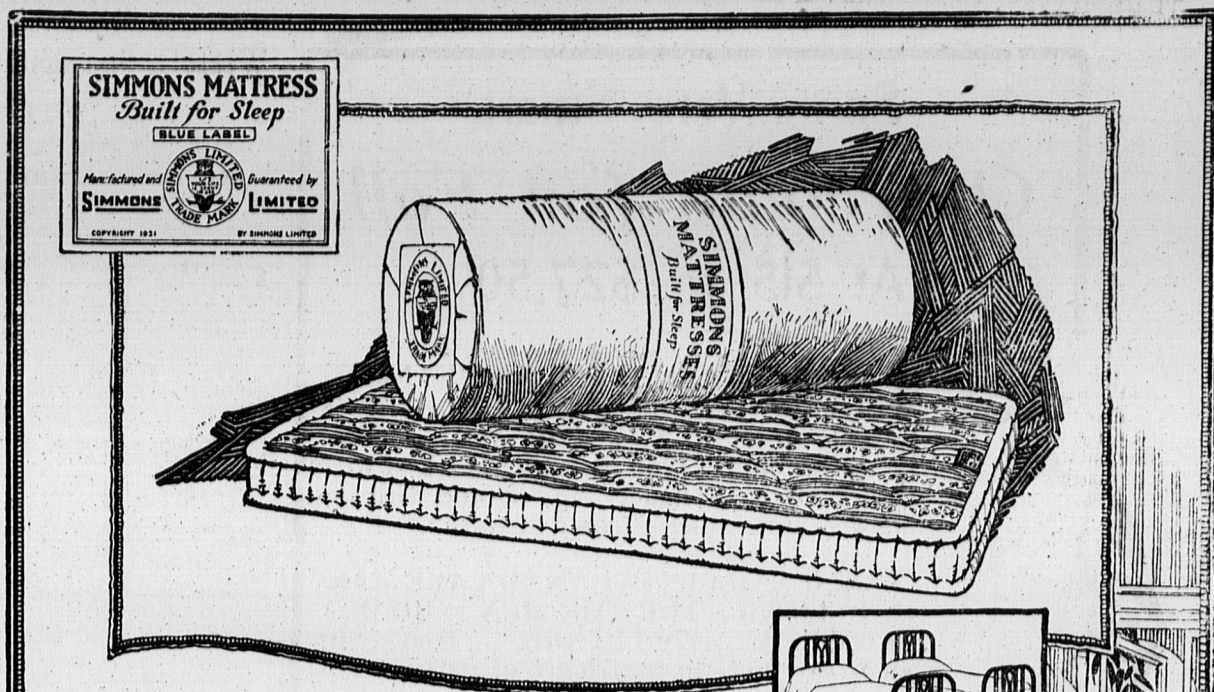
A number of Laplanders were also engaged to take care of the animals, which will be despatched in September.

A plan for converting the Arctic and South-Arctic regions of Canada into a great wool, milk and meat-producing area was presented to the Canadian Government by Vilhjalmur Stefansson, the Norwegian explorer of the Canadian Arctic, more than two years ago.

His project involved the introduction into the Canadian North of large herds of reindeer, and also the domestication and development of great herds of musk ox. He estimated that there were from 1,000,000 to 2,000,000 square miles of

## SIMMONS BEDS

Built for Sleep

LONDON, Sept. 13.—Admiral Penrose Fitzgerald, whose death relieved one of the navy's most respected figures, has been buried at sea near Folkestone. Sewn up in a weighted blanket and covered with the Union Jack the body was taken in a motor boat manned by four fishermen to the East Varne buoy, between eight and nine miles from Folkestone. The admiral's widow and two sons and two daughters accompanied the remains. The Rev. L. R. Grey read the service, which was that used for those buried at sea. No instructions were left by the Admiral for his funeral, but his family knowing his love for the sea acted in accordance with what they believed to be his wishes.

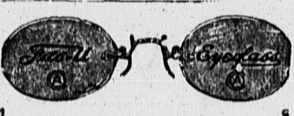
