Thoughts For Our Time

Original sin is the elusive, long-sought "element X" of moral life whose presence, long unobserved by many, explains much that is puzzling in human behavior.

Its real malignancy in our day should be as obvious as any experience can be. Perhaps the surest indication of its reality is the constant effort we make to blind ourselves to its presence. Yet for the man who has eyes willing to see, it will be seen. It cannot be that we are unaware of the signs of original sin, for they impinge upon our lives at every turn. The fact is, we simply refuse to recognize them for what they are... perhaps because such recognition would impose severe responsibilities upon us!

What, you may very well ask, are these signs we refuse to see? They may all be joined under one heading: disorder in human affairs. Theologians tell us that the fundamental meaning of original sin is the loss of original justice, a term indicating an original state of man wherein order reigned. Now by "order" they simply mean that each thing, each

power, each person came from the hand of God with such relations established between them that a beautiful, natural harmony resulted. And created nature on every side also held its due place of respect towards the One who made it. Man, as the noblest of earthly creatures, held dominion over himself and the whole of nature in obedience to God.

That was the justice God established in creation, it was the order man destroyed by his spiritual pride—he would be like God, as Satan told him, he would fashion his own order. In the disorder that followed his act of injustice, man lost his control over nature, his power over himself and, worst of all, he forsook all respect for God. From that disorder arose all the disturbances, unreasonable actions and irresponsibilities that mark our world of today. Need we enumerate such realities in detail? Perhaps darkness in understanding and stubbornness of will—results of original sin—dictate that we do so.

Report On Farm Prices & Markets

Following are excerpts from the latest review of market conditions, prepared by Mr. W.R. Shaw, Deputy Minister of Agriculture:

As far as the general marketing situation is concerned there has been very little change from last week. The following prices will indicate the price levels at each centre:

Foundation A and Certified are 68¢ per bushel at the car with a light movement. Table stock is 70¢ a bag at the car with a few moving.

O'Leary — Sebagoes are 66¢ per bushel; Foundation Mountains 85¢ per bushel at the car with a light movement. There is some criticism of car shortage but this will no doubt be promptly rectified. Table stock is 60¢ per bushel at the warehouse.

Wellington — No. 1 seed is 63¢ per bushel at the farm with table stock 70¢ per bushel at the car. Refer cars are reported scarce this week.

Summerside — Seed is 70¢ per bushel at the wharf, 65¢ at the farm. Small Sebagoes are 75¢ per bushel at the car, Tablestock is 70-75¢ per bushel at the car with a fair movement this week.

Borden Line — Seed generally is 75¢ per bushel at the farm with Foundation 75¢ per bushel. Table-

stock is 72-75¢ per bushel at the farm.

Charlottetown — All seed is moving at 70¢ per bushel at the car, or boat, with a heavy movement. Tablestock is 70-75¢ per bushel at the car with a fair movement for the past few days.

Vernon River — Sebago and Mountain seed 70¢ per bushel at the car. Tablestock 60¢ per bushel at the car. Movement fair. Short of receivers.

Cardigan and Montague — Seed Mountains and Cobblers and Sebagoes 65-70¢ per bushel with a light movement. Tablestock is 55-60¢ per bushel at the farm. Fair movement.

Morell — Seed Sebagoes 60¢ per bushel; Katahdins, Sebagoes, and Mountains 70¢ per bushel at the car. Tablestock offering for 35¢ per bushel, but none moving.

Elmira — Seed — Katahdins No. 1 65¢; B's 75¢ per bushel at car. Fair movement, with a shortage of cars. No tablestock moving. Boats are loading at Summerside, Victoria, Charlottetown and Souris.

Kensington — Seed — 70¢ per bushel at warehouse. Tablestock 75¢ per bushel at warehouse. Not fussy about Cobblers at this price.
