Price Of Peace Calls For Ceding Of Sudetenland

REINFORCES BORDER FORCES WARSZAWA, Poland, Sept. 19—It was officially announced tonight that Poland is reinforcing her troops along the Czechoslovak frontier because Czech troops have been increased ostensibly to prevent deserters from crossing the border.
DENOUNCE SECESSION PLAN LONDON, Sept. 19—The reported Anglo-French proposal to cede predominantly Sudeten German areas of Czechoslovakia to Germany was denounced tonight by the National Council of Labor as a "shameful betrayal of a peaceful and democratic people."
LAUNCH NEUTRALITY DRIVE LOS ANGELES, Sept. 19—The opening gun in the American Legion's new big power drive to keep the United States out of war was fired today by United States Senator David I. Walsh.
