### FIND PARTS OF HACKED BODY

CHICAGO, Aug. 28 (CP)—Two bundles containing portions of a hacked-up body were found today on opposite sides of the Chicago River, and police said cuts severing the parts were fresh. A bundle containing a thigh, a left hand, part of a left arm cut off just below the elbow, and two feet, apparently those of a man, was found wrapped in a white sheet and in two Polish language newspapers, by a dock worker. A subsequent police search of the opposite bank disclosed another bundle, containing portions

of two legs, from the ankle to the knee, and a portion of a right arm, including the hand. The left hand, covered with callouses, still was attached to the segment of the arm and the fingers were discolored by nicotine stains.

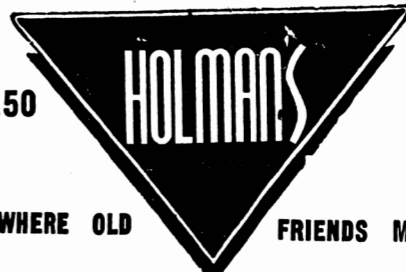
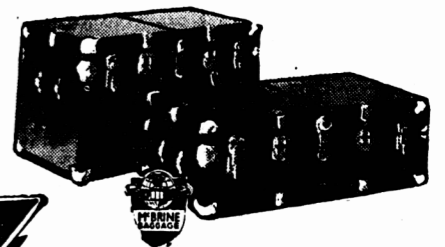
