There will be a special meeting of the Knights of Columbus this evening at 8 o'clock. A full attendance requested.

Miss Whidden of New York is expected in the city by the Boston boat this morning and will visit her sister Mrs (Prof) Barlow.

Mrs (Rev) H. E. Thomas, City, returned last evening from St. John where she attended the convention of the Women's Missionary Society.

Captain Robinson, City, of the Salvation Army, leaves this morning for Halifax. He will return Wednesday night accompanying the Middlemore Home children to this city.

The regular monthly meeting of the P. E. Island Poultry Association will be held in the Prince of Wales College room this evening at 7.30 sharp. As date for next show will be selected a full attendance is requested.

The members of Branch No 216, C. M. B. A., are requested to meet in their hall Wednesday morning, the eighth instant, at nine o'clock, wearing white gloves and white tie, for the purpose of attending the funeral of their late Brother Dr. F. F. Kelly.

Miss Lois Taylor, daughter of Capt T. G. and Mrs Taylor, City, returned last night from Sackville where she had been attending Mt Allison. Miss Taylor has been visiting in Dorchester, N. B., for the past week where she was the guest of Mr and Mrs Chapman.

The party of immigrant children from the Middlemore Home, Birmingham, England, will arrive in Charlottetown by the Northumberland on Wednesday night and will be at the Lowell House, 119 Dorchester Street. The parties who have applied through the Halifax Agency for the children will kindly meet them at the above named place after the arrival of the boat.

Dr. J. S. Bagnall, City, returned last evening from Toronto where he attended the recent convention of Dentists and Medical Associations of Canada. There were nearly one thousand dentists and doctors in attendance at the separate conventions and most profitable sessions of both organizations were held. The arrangements for the entertainment of the visiting gentlemen were complete and perhaps the most enjoyable of the excursions was the trip on Thursday to Niagara Falls and Friday's visit to the Lambton Golf Links which are said to be the best in the world. The Club House accommodates one hundred people. Dr. H. D. Johnson, City, who also attended the convention, will not arrive home for some time as he intends to stop off in Montreal where he will attend the meeting of a Tuberculosis convention. He will then go to St. John and will be there on the occasion of General French's visit. Dr. Carruthers, another Charlottetown delegate, will probably not return for some days.

The regular monthly meeting of the School Board was held last evening at 7.30. The teachers' report showed the enrolment for the past month to be 1094, the actual attendance 1014, the average attendance 926.5 and the percentage 91.66. There were 198 cases of tardiness, no cases of truancy, 99 visits, 63 notices, 12 cases of corporal punishment and 34 fell below average in grading. Seven teachers reported no cases of tardiness, three reported only one case and five two cases. The highest percentage in attendance was made by Vice-Principal Bennet whose department made 100 per cent. This record was reached only once before in the City Schools on an occasion when a prize was offered for the best attendance in the City Schools—twenty-five teachers had an attendance of 90 per cent and over. The closing exercises of the Schools will be held as follows: West Kent School on Wednesday the 29th inst. at 11 a.m. Queen Square School on Thursday the 30th from 9 to 11 a.m. and Prince Street School from 11 a.m. to 1 o'clock. A committee was appointed to consider the feasibility of arranging departments so as to give Prince Street School a hall for massing the pupils. The Secretary was directed to call for tenders for coal and wood for the current year. After passing some bills the meeting adjourned.

The mail train arrived in this city last night at ten forty-five.

Sunday evening in Halifax, Rev G. E. Ross of this city officiated at the Kaye Street Methodist church.

The C. G. S. Minto leaves this afternoon for Halifax where she will go on the dry dock. She will receive a coat of paint and will be generally overhauled.

Many visitors have viewed with pleasure the fine samples of drawing painting and fancy work exhibited by the pupils of Notre Dame Academy during the past few days.

The many friends of Bruce Taylor, City, who recently left for the Canadian West, will regret to learn that since his arrival out west he has been in a hospital undergoing treatment almost continuously. He is now recovering.

Dr A. F. McVinnie, F. E. Savre and A. W. Adams, St John, arrived in the city last evening and registered at the Victoria. The party, who have Morson's Pond leased, intend to spend a short holiday exploring their preserves.

Philip Freeland, M. and C. E., nephew of Edward Bayfield, is visiting Charlottetown, after an absence of twenty-six years. Mr. Freeland is the son of Colonel Freeland, and was born at Brighton, his parents then occupying the residence now owned by W. C. White, Colonel and Mrs. Freeland are now living in Devonshire, England. Mr. Freeland left here when a young child and was educated abroad. He has been engaged in Civil and Mining Engineering in Vancouver Island, Arizona, Mexico and other places and will leave shortly for South America.
