Recognition of Common Trees and Shrubs It is well to recognize various common trees and shrubs if you should be called upon to give a description of an area through which you have travelled, to say that it is "well-wooded" is not enough; you should indicate the kind of tree the surrounding country contains. For instance, a quantity of fir or birch trees would mean that you could get poles for building bridges if there were palm trees, you know, you could get coconuts or date if they were date palms, and you would be able to palm-juice for drinking purposes if you mean that there was water close by or if you reported pine or sugar maples or gum trees, it would mean that there was good fuel. You should know the names of the following common trees of Canada: oak, elm, plane cedar, willow, poplar, pine, aspen, maple, horse chestnut, ash, beech, birch, spruce and fir.
