The Northumberland left Charlottetown at 8:20 this morning for Pictou with a fair passenger list and a general cargo.

In view of the interesting incident of this week, the appointment and ordination of missionaries sent out by the Church of Scotland to Nova Scotia, at the period in question, may be appropriately referred to. It was remarked by a correspondent of the press that whilst the different religious denominations in this colony were laudably and zealously engaged in promoting the interests of their respective churches, in opening new missions,—in building churches,—in appointing ministers,—in forming and supporting district and missionary associations, and other good works,—it was pleasing to find that the church of Scotland was not unmindful of her numerous members and adherents in this part of the world. A very large increase had taken place in the number of her clergymen in Nova Scotia within six months. Early in the month of August the Rev. Dr. Ritchie and the Rev. Wm. Sutherland arrived, as a deputation from the apparent church to the ministers and congregations in this and the neighboring colonies. About the middle of September the Rev. Alex McKay arrived as missionary to his countrymen in Pictou. In the beginning of October other two missionaries reached our shores—the Rev. Mr. Murray, appointed to Bathurst, N. B., and the Rev. Swm. Snodgrass, as successor to the Rev. Robert McNair, in Charlottetown. P. E. L.—Halifax Exe.
