HANDS ARE IN GOOD SHAPE

NEW YORK, Nov. 30.—Incidental to his knocking out of Jack Thomson, a rawhide and iron negro from Boston, in the First Regiment Army, Newark, several nights ago, Harry Willis showed the discerning ones among the throng of 12,000 persons who crowded the big drill shed that he was strong where he was supposed to be weak.

The Black Panther of New Orleans fought a sloppy contest, but he gave Thomson such a terrific beating that the Boston negro's hands were tossed to the ring in the fourth round after Jack had been floored twice in that session.

Hands Are O. K. Short as the contest was it showed two important things. One was that there is nothing the matter with Willis' hands.

Ever since Harry injured both hands on Clem Johnson's corrugated cork the whisper in boxing circles has been that Willis' hands are brittle and would not stand up under punching.

Willis showed the fallacy of that idea by hitting Thomson with everything except the proverbial water bucket. He smashed Thomson about the head with innumerable blows. No hand's not made of iron would have held up under the battering.

But if Willis' hands are strong, his legs and wind are not.

Needs Road Work

Harry is a gymnasium trained athlete. That is the answer. He has worked hard in the gymnasium and has a good deal of muscular flesh, is a most interesting looking specimen, and to all outward signs and appearances is fit as a fiddle.

He has neglected road work, however, and that dereliction of training duties has left both his legs and wind weak.

Willis punched himself out on Thomson each round before the round was half over. He started each round like a whirlwind, only to blow up, and before the end of the round invariably was flat on his heels, puffing like a porpoise and so "tied up" that all the snap and drive were missing from his blows.

That he was in good condition otherwise was shown by his quick recuperation between rounds. The fact that he couldn't carry the pace for a full round, however, showed that he was lacking in the lung and leg power which only long road work and long hikes in the open can supply.

If Willis should ever enter the ring against Dempsey with wind and legs no better than they were on the recent occasion Harry wouldn't last more than a couple of rounds.

FIRPO WILL MEET WILLS

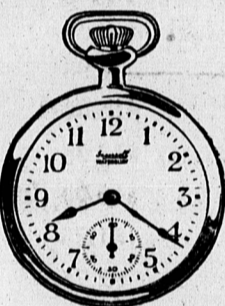

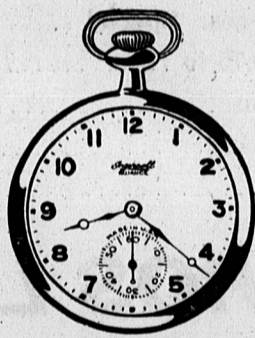
