New York Stocks Take Nosedive

NEW YORK, Oct. 30 (AP)—Stocks went into one of the steepest nose-dives of the last two months in today's market but supporting bids arrived at the last and substantially cut extreme losses of 1 to 4 or more points. Transfers totalled 1,390,000 shares. The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off .8 of a point at 65.2 at a bottom since Oct. 8. Canadian issues were lower. McIntyre lost 1. Distillers Seagrams dropped 5-8 and Canadian Pacific was down 3-8. Hiram Walker was down 1-4 while Dome Mines eased 1-8. On the Curb, Lake Shore eased 1-8. Bethlehem Steel finished off 7-8 of a point at 97 1/8. International Silver was off 3 3/8 points at 59 3/8. Du Pont 2 1-2 at 136. Montgomery Ward 2 1/8 at 56 1/8 and Santa Fe 2 at 51. U. S. Steel conceded 5-8 at 78 3/4. Down around a point or more were: American Smelt-Jung 3/4, Union Carbide 105, Johns-Manville 42 7/8, Standard Oil (NJ) 75 3/4, and Texas Pacific 42 1/2. Coal and Oil 42 5/8, Pennsylvania 33 1/2, but emerged with a low since 1941 at 17 3/8. Deep Rock Oil was a lone strong spot, climbing 2 points at 45 1/2. 1947 peak. Chrysler and Norfolk and Western added fractions.

Mining Issues Decline At Toronto

TORONTO, Oct. 30 (CP)—Mining issues extended price range with the trend downward although volume was restricted on the Toronto Stock Exchange today.

Senior golds posted gains only for collinger and La Luz with losses for Dome Kerr Adelson and 1 1/2 points at 64 for McIntyre. Better gains among the few juniors ahead were Buffadison, Preston, Pioneer, San Antonio 20 at \$4.40, Texas Cambell, West, Cochenour, Cronier, Giant, Goldcrest, Louvencourt, Macassa, MacLeod, O'Brien, Perron, Powell, Preston, Sylvan.

International Uranium led basic metals gainers on a turnover of about 88,000 shares to rise 9 at 63 with others ahead Golden Manitou, Normetal and Quebec Manicouag. Losers were: Max Bentley, Hudson Bay, Nickel a heavy trader down 1-4 at 32 1/8, Labrador, Noranda, Quomont, Sherritt, Steep Rock, Waite Amulet.

Evidence Western Canada Takes Its Hockey Seriously

EDMONTON, Oct. 29—Anyone doubting that western Canada takes its hockey seriously should cast an eye over pleasantries exchanged by Tom (Calgary Alberta) Moore and Lorimer (Lethbridge Herald) Fenwick.

The banter began when Moore expressed the opinion that the Western Canada Senior Hockey League was almost of National League caliber. Calgary Stampeders looked like a better club than Chicago Black Hawks and Max Bentley wouldn't stand out like a sore thumb as he does with Hawks.

Snapped Lorimer: "Utter nonsense. Going a bit too far." This drove to research work. From Calgary's Senior Service League of 1944-45, Max Bentley moved to the National League to become its most valuable player and leading scorer, he said.

Eddie Slowinski went to Chicago Rangers, Alex Galtea to Chicago. During the last three seasons, seven of the remaining eight of the Service League's top 12 became members of Calgary's Stampeders at some time.

"When three-quarters of the top dozen players in a league of that calibre go to one club, and one of the few others immediately becomes such an outstanding N.H.L. star as Max Bentley, the team that got the eight players not only must be a great club but the league in which it plays must be a great circuit," said Thomas.

"A third-rate loop" he queried indignantly. "Nerts! It can look that way only to third-rate experts."

Back came Lorimer: "We are not a bit annoyed with our old pal Tom. From now on we are going to agree with him wholeheartedly in everything sensible he says. We are even going to agree that the N. H. L. is no stronger than the W.C.S.H.L., and that fellows like Bentley, Apps, Richard, Bouchard, Lach, Durnan, Jack Stewart and Brimsek would be no more outstanding in the west than they are right now in the east."

He added: "We know that it is difficult to argue sensibly with men like Tom, who have had so much experience watching N.H.L. teams in action, gassing with big time operators like Ben Tobin and pecking furiously into telegrams. So from now on we're going to keep away from that sledhammer of his."

Industrials Lead Retreat At Montreal

MONTREAL, Oct. 30 (CP)—Industrials generally closed at easier levels on the stock exchange and curb market here today. Trading was lively. Mines were moderately active and exhibited a negative trend. Closing index averages indicated banks up .12 to .27; utilities off .1 to .76; industrials off 1.6 to 12.5; papers off .76 to .38.27 and golds off .26 to .76.5. Volume was 73,200 industrial shares and 278,900 mining shares. Exception to the general trend in papers was B. C. Forest, which added 1-8 on a heavy turnover. Leading the losers was International off 2 1/2 points at 59 1/4. Price dropped 1 1/4 at 63 3/4, Abitibi 3/4 at 17 3/4. Consolidated 3/4 at 18 3/4, and Howard Smith 1-2 at 30 1/2. Donnacona, Brown and Abitibi Pfd., were all off minor fractions. In the utilities Winnipeg Electric was active and ahead 1 1/8 points at 21. Power Corp added 1/4 at 15. Southmount and Shawinigan were shaded. In carriers C.P.R. went down 3/8 at 13 1/2. Consolidated Smelting lost a point in metals and International Nickel 3/8 at 89 1/2 and 32 1/8, respectively. In the banks National was up 1/2 and in the leveraged Seagrams was down 1/4. Other industrial losers included Atlas, actively traded, off 3-8 and Industrial Alcohol "A" off 1-2. In the mines, Bob's Lake and Central Cadillac were the center of attraction, the former losing 1 1/2 cents at 28 1/4 and the latter closing unchanged at 20. Gainers included Eldona, up 3 cents. Down were Beatrice a cent, Corsex a cent and East Sullivan 5.
