CLAUDE McDONALD TRANSFERRED

And Sir Ernest Mason Satow Replaces Him as British Minister to China.
LONDON, Sept. 21.—A despatch to the Times from Shanghai, dated yesterday, asserts that Sir Claude Macdonald will become British Minister at Tokio and will be succeeded at Peking by Sir Ernest Mason Satow, the present British Minister at the Japanese capital.
"This," says the Times' correspondent, "is disappointing to Britishers in the far East, as they had hoped that a stronger diplomatist would be sent to Peking."
It is probable that Vice-Admiral Seymour will meet Sir Claude Macdonald at Tien Tsin.
Reports from Nankin point to the increasing activity and influence of the anti-foreign party. The manner in which the Yang-tse viceroys have been ignored by the throne in reference to the peace negotiations, while imperial edicts order the Manchu leaders to resume the control of affairs is capable of only one interpretation. Shanghai specials seem to show quite a shower of edicts regarding negotiators, to which little importance is attached.

A Structure that Will Support as Much Weight as Can Be Put Upon It.
QUEBEC, Sept. 19.—Greater in many respects than the wonderful Firth of Forth bridge will be the structure that will span the St. Lawrence river at this ancient capital. The preliminary work has already begun. The total cost of the bridge will be \$4,000,000. All the contracts have been made. The Phoenix Bridge Building Company, of Phoenixville, Pa., has received the award for the iron and steel work.
The cantilever span of the new bridge will be about 1,800 feet long, 90 feet longer than that over the Firth of Forth. The total length will be 3,600 feet. The centre span will be 150 feet above high water, and the height of the two centre spans will be 150 feet above high water and the height of the two centre piers of masonry above high tide will be 30 feet, while the elevation of the cantilevers above the top of the masonry will be 350 feet. Besides the two abutments one on either side of the river, and the two water piers at the ends of the great centre span, there will be two anchor piers, each 400 feet away from its neighboring abutment, and 500 feet from the nearest deep water pier.
The amount of masonry entering into the construction of the bridge is estimated at 50,000 cubic yards. The piers are to be finished this year. The two deep water piers will require a season for each. One will be begun in May of next year, and completed before winter, and the other will be built in the open season of 1902.
The huge pneumatic caissons, which are to be constructed this winter and launched as required, will measure 168 by 50 feet, with a height of 30 feet, or a base area of 8,400 square feet.
The bridge is to have double railway tracks, besides road ways for carriages, electric cars and pedestrians going in both directions. It will be strong enough to bear the weight of as many heavy locomotives as can be crowded upon it. The railways to use it will be the Grand Trunk, the Quebec Central, the Great Northern, the Intercolonial, the Canadian Pacific and the Quebec and Lake St. John.
