COMMITTEE ON LIFE-SAVING.

LONDON, Aug. 15.—The Merchant Shipping Advisory Committee of the Board of Trade, to which was referred the question raised by the Titanic disaster as to what changes in the existing regulations regarding life saving appliances were necessary, today issued its report.

The committee states that the disaster demonstrated the extraordinary difficulty experienced by ships carrying large numbers of passengers in utilizing their full capacity, even in calm weather, the boats at ready provided and declares that the best method to insure the safety of passengers is to insure the buoyancy of a vessel after a casualty.
