HALIFAX, Jan. 27.—Two men were injured and one killed in an accident at the dockyard this morning. Kenneth Halfpenny, Wm. Sullivan and Gates were at work upon a gas buoy, recently brought into port and placed on the pier for overhauling when it exploded and all three were burned. Gates was thrown by the force of the explosion against an iron boiler nearby, and had an arm broken and shoulder dislocated. He died tonight.
