SUBMARINE CABLES' FOES

LONDON, Jan. 18.—The vicissitudes of a submarine cable are many. It may be torn by an anchor, crushed by a rock or seriously damaged by a coral reef such as abound in the tropics. Some of the growths often found on a cable tend gradually to decay the iron sheathing wires. Then, again a cable is sometimes served by a seaquake. It may be fatally attacked by the snout of a sawfish or by the spike of a swordfish. But perhaps the little animal that makes itself most objectionable from the cable engineer's standpoint is the insignificant looking teredo nautilus. This little beast is intensely greedy where gutta percha is concerned, working its way there between the iron wires and between the serving yarns. The silica in the outer tereido's efforts at making a meal of the core and this defeat is further effected by the core being enveloped in a thin taping of brass.

From one cause or another faults occur in most cables from time to time. These require to be electrically localized from the cable testing hut and a ship sent out to the supposed position to grapple for the line, pick it up and effect the necessary repairs. When the cable has really been hooked and picked up an operation which may entail several weeks or even months, if only in waiting for favorable weather—the light is secured at the bows and afterward cut. Each end is then brought on board alternately and tested electrically. It found to be sound the necessary repairs are then effected.

A REMARKABLE LOST WILL CASE

PARIS, Jan. 19.—A remarkable will case is occupying the courts at St. Etienne. One day a local priest, according to his own statement brought at a second hand bookstall a book in which he discovered a will made by a wealthy old lady, who had recently died. The will left the whole of her property, £20,000 to a young girl, a distant relative. The priest revealed the will to the girl's family and a claim was immediately made for the property, which on the old lady's death had gone to her direct heirs. These heirs contested the validity of the will, asserting that it was a forgery. They have now succeeded in proving that the book which the priest brought at a second hand bookstall any connection with the testatrix. The question arises, How did the will come to be found in a book which had never been in the old lady's possession?

AWARDS FROM CARNEGIE FUND

PITTSBURG, Pa., Jan. 19.—The Carnegie Herd Commission at its fourth annual meeting held here today, awarded nine silver and eleven bronze medals for acts of heroism, besides \$10,050 in cash to the heroes or their dependents and monthly payments during life to two widows and their minor children. Ten other cases investigated since the October meeting are rejected as not being within the scope of the fund. Among the more notable awards are the following:—Newell S. Gilman, aged 19, of Lowell, Mass., at Old Orchard, Maine, on August 23, 1906, rescued from drowning in the Atlantic ocean, Joseph S. Murdock, aged 33, of Philadelphia, who became exhausted while swimming; silver medal and \$2,000 for educational purposes needed by a young man. William L. Donovan, aged 24, a machinist of Lynn, Mass., who at Nahant, Mass., on June 3, 1906, saved Jennie Wilson aged 30, and attempted to save Annabelle Parnell, aged 30, from drowning when they fell overboard from a yacht, silver medal and \$2,000 to be applied upon the purchase of a home or such other purpose as the commission may approve.

BOSTON OFFICER KILLED IN STREET

BOSTON, Jan. 18.—Patrolman John T. Lynch, connected with division two, and who has been on the Boston police force for a year and a half, was shot three times in the body by a man he found acting suspiciously on Kingston street, and died within an hour at the relief station. The officer was patrolling his beat when he saw two men near the corner of Summer and Kingston streets who, he thought, were acting suspiciously. He accosted the men and asked them where they were going. They responded "nowhere." The officer stepped up to the men and put his hands on their clothing to see what they might be carrying in their pockets, when suddenly one of them whipped out a revolver and fired three times at the officer, one bullet striking Lynch in the abdomen. Patrolman Lynch grappled with the man and had thrown him to the ground and was holding him there when Patrolman Doyle, hearing the shots, ran to the rescue. The man was taken into custody. The man who did the shooting, upon being questioned at the police station, stated that his name was William Foley, aged twenty-four years, and that he had no home. Besides the thirty-eight calibre revolver he carried, there was found on his person fifty rounds of ammunition and a bunch of skeleton keys. Lynch was twenty-eight years old, and unmarried.

REINDEER FOR THE LABRADOR

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld., Jan. 18.—The herd of reindeer imported from Norway by Dr. Wilfred Grenfell, the celebrated missionary, were landed at Cremlle Harbor, Labrador, under difficulties. The deer were placed on board the steamer "Anita" at St. John's, but, on account of numerous ice floes, the boat was unable to get near the shore. The animals were lowered from the steamer to a body of ice. When the deck hands started to drive the deer to land it was found that the ice was very thin, and, in spite of the efforts of the men, several animals broke through and perished. The bull of the herd was driven ashore safely. A short time later a storm arose and the "Anita" was forced on a reef. Her bottom was badly damaged, and her sides were crushed by a huge ice floe, which was carried against the vessel. The boat remained afloat, however, and was able to reach St. John's. She arrived yesterday, leaking badly.
