"The English vocabulary has grown to great size," says Professor Clark S. Northrup, of Cornell University, one of the contributors to The New Universities Dictionary now being distributed by this paper exclusively to its readers. "The number of words found in Old English literature does not exceed thirty thousand, more than four hundred thousand, mostly of foreign origin. Yet most writers use mainly English words."

"Shakespeare used ninety per cent of English words; the English Bible contains ninety-four per cent; Milton eighty-one per cent; Addison eighty-two per cent; Tennyson eighty-eight per cent. Most of our shortest and simplest words are of native origin."
