EDUCATIONAL MEETING.—The educational campaign meeting held at Webster's Corner on the 15th inst., was fairly well attended. Mr. Patrick McGuirk occupied the chair. Mr. J. F. Doyle, gave a very interesting discourse on the educational situation; stating that there were sixty schools vacant in the province, and attributed the deplorable fact to the small remuneration offered teachers. He also referred to the fact that the average attendance of pupils of school age was only fifty per cent of those enrolled. Other speakers expressed themselves strongly in favor of more pay for teachers; one of them remarking that the present salary offered is an insult to those in the profession. Resolutions read by Inspector Doyle were unanimously adopted. One delegate from each of the adjoining districts was appointed to attend the final meeting of the campaign to be held in Charlottetown on the 30th inst.
