U.S. GUNNERS GOOD SHOOTING

NEW YORK, Oct. 23.—The battleship Maine, the flagship of Rear Admiral Evans, reached port today from the Massachusetts coast, where she engaged in target practice.

According to a report that reached shore through some of the crew, all gunnery records were broken by the Maine's crew. It is said 39 out of a possible 39 hits were made in firing a port broadside of six-inch guns at a target two miles distant. The target was sixty by thirty feet and was knocked down, it is stated, by the thirty-ninth shot. The guns were in charge of Lieut. Williams, Esq'n Levey and Midshipman Sweeney. The practice was new to the gunners of the United States navy. It is known as broadside firing, all the guns on one side of the ship being fired on signal at a target placed not less than 4,000 yards away. The first broadside of five shots went wide. The second broadside took from twenty to twenty-five seconds to fire, then as the range was found the guns were loaded and fired faster and faster until eight broadsides were fired in 160 seconds.

CRIME CARNIVAL IN MANITOBA

WINNIPEG, Oct. 23.—The Fall Assizes for the four judicial districts opened this month, and the big lists are published tomorrow morning. The calendars are such as to indicate that during the last half-year there has been an awful carnival of crime throughout the whole of Manitoba, it being confined to no particular district, though in the eastern portion it is most alarming to note the number of men charged with murder. For the first time in the history of the province juries will have to try men for capital punishment in each of the judicial divisions of Manitoba. In Winnipeg charges of murder will be preferred against nearly a dozen men and charges of a like nature will be laid in Brandon, Portage la Prairie and Morden. It is estimated that about 70 indictments will be presented to the grand jury at the sittings, which open here next Tuesday, all of which are of a most serious character, the gravest offences being against the Gallian and foreign elements in the north end of Winnipeg.

THE EXHIBITION AT EGMONT BAY

It is not generally known that there is held at Egmont Bay yearly an event of more than local importance. Since the year of 1905 the inhabitants of Egmont Bay, Urbenville, and Mount Carmel have each year gathered together at a central point to compare notes and exhibit the result of their efforts in the agricultural and industrial line. In the year 1903 the exhibition was merely in the way of an informal gathering held at Urbenville under the auspices of the Union Farmers Institute. Owing to the interest taken by the people, the next year it was decided to hold it at Egmont Bay and to throw their competition open to the farmers of Egmont Bay as well as Urbenville. In 1905 Mount Carmel was also permitted to exhibit, and such was the showing made and the number and importance of the exhibits that this year it was decided to invite His Honor, the Lieutenant Governor to grace the occasion with his presence, and on the invitation of Fathers Bondwell and Arsenault, of Egmont Bay and Mount Carmel on behalf of the promoters. Gov. McKinnon was present Wednesday at Egmont Bay to open the exhibition at 1 o'clock. A large number of people gathered in front of the parochial house at Egmont, near which the exhibition is held, and Mr. Blanchard on behalf of the Union Farmers Institute pre-ented His Honor with an address of welcome. The Lieutenant Governor replied in well chosen words expressing his pleasure at being present to and encouragement to the noble effort being made in this section of the island towards the encouragement of agriculture. He expressed his belief that by such efforts as were being made a beneficial rivalry was encouraged among farmers who would necessarily learn a great deal from their neighbors and fellow competitors. After formally opening the exhibition His Honor, accompanied by a number of representative men, made a round of the exhibits and expressed surprise at seeing the variety and excellence of the things exhibited. The interest taken was shown by the large number of people present. The weather was beautiful and everything passed off agreeably. A list of the prizes, which were many, will be published later. The officers of the Institute are: Rev. S. F. Bondwell, President; Rev. P. P. Arsenault, Vice Pres.; E. Fortier, Treas., and Stanislaus Blanchard, Sec.
