A UNION temperance thanksgiving service was held in the Methodist church Sunday evening. There was no service in the Baptist church, that congregation joining with the Methodist. Dr. Borden presided. Dr. Brecken in seconding a resolution calling upon the meeting to sanction the enforcement of the act for third and fourth offences by imprisonment, expressed the opinion that the onus of enforcing the act should not be allowed to rest entirely upon the temperance people. He thought the government should assist in enforcing it; that they should furnish at least some of the machinery necessary at its enforcement. The trouble with the Scott Act was that it had not teeth enough, or if it had they were false teeth. The speaker said he recognized that to enforce the act meant warfare, but he was willing to do what he could to assist the temperance party in their efforts in this direction. It afforded him much pleasure to second the adoption of this resolution—carried unanimously. - Sackville Post.

THE St. John Globe, December 5th says:—A very interesting case was before Judge Forbes in Chambers this morning—that of Wener vs. Jacobson. The defendant, who belongs in Souris, P. E. I., arrived in St. John last fall to attend the Jewish religious service and while here, was arrested on a County Court writ of capias at the suit of the plaintiff, who belongs to Montreal. None of the parties to the suit live, or did the cause of action arise, within the province. A summons was taken out by the plaintiff, calling upon the defendant to show cause why judgment should not be signed against him. Argument took place this morning, and the question of jurisdiction was exhaustively gone into. Counsel for the defendant argued that the County Court had no jurisdiction unless either the plaintiff or defendant resided within the province, or the cause of action arose within the province. Counsel for the plaintiff argued that the court had jurisdiction the moment the defendant came within the jurisdiction, and it made no difference whether the parties to the suit resided within the province or not. Judge Forbes reserved his decision. Messrs. A. A. Stockton, Q. C., and J. King Kelley for the plaintiff, and Mr. Scott E. Morrill for the defendant.

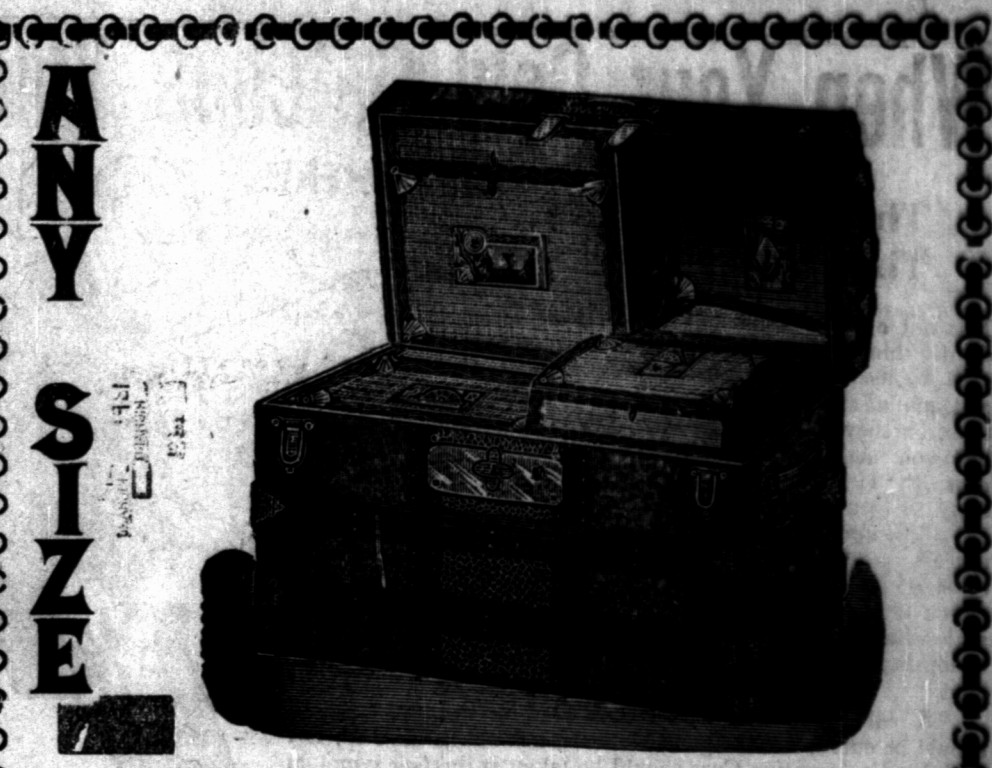
