W. F. Boggis, after spending a few days in Moncton, has returned to Charlottetown. He was accompanied by his brother H. Boggis, who will spend a few days on the island.

Thomas White of Hill, N. Y., died on the 28th, April 1st. Mr. White was born seventy-eight years ago in Prince Edward Island, and was one of twelve brothers and sisters. He leaves a widow and one son Allen. He was a brother of the late William White of Montague.

Lobsters were in fair supply at the market yesterday, but fishermen report that they have not been able to carry on fishing on an extended scale as yet, owing to the ice which is still floating around the coast. A number of fishermen have lost herring nets lately, because of this drift ice.

Rev. Wm. Dubon, president of the N. B. & P. E. I. conference, addressed the theological students of the University of Mt. Allison, Monday evening on the work of the ministry and the necessary qualifications for it. The address, which was an able one, was much enjoyed by the students.

J. & T. Jardine's sawmill has begun sawing. The schooner Maple Leaf, Capt. Fraser, sailed yesterday morning with a load of lumber for Charlottetown. P. E. I. The schooner Magpie Roach sailed Thursday, lumber laden, for Summerside. These are the first vessels to sail from this port this season.—Moncton Transcript.

Late copies of Yukon newspapers contain a very graphic account of the progress shown by Sergeant A. A. McMillan of the Royal North West Mounted Police, in arresting a couple of "bad men" in Dawson City, recently. Sergeant McMillan is a native of Wood Islands, and formerly lived at Murray River. He is spoken of as a pretty able officer and a terror to evildoers.

A northwest breeze springing up, they were unable to find their way back to the ship. The two men are Frank and Edwin Landry, of Tuskent, N. S. About 15 miles from the vessel were 15 French vessels, and it is hoped that the men may be picked up by one of them.

Colin C. Ferguson, son of Senator Ferguson, recently successfully passed the final examinations of the Actuarial Society of North America, by which he became a Fellow of that organization. Very few Canadians have attained this distinction.

There are at present nearly a dozen schooners anchored out in the harbor. A number of them are vessels which tried to get away on Thursday but were forced to return on account of the ice outside, and the others are schooners, loaded and ready to sail at the first favorable opportunity.

The S. S. Stanley arrived in this port yesterday afternoon shortly after four o'clock from Pictou. She was detained some hours on the passage owing to fog. There was not so much ice to be seen yesterday in the night. The Stanley had a number of passengers, the mails and her freight consisted of four cars of flour and one car of beer.
