NEWSY FARM NOTES By Agricola

Fertilizer Analyses

A little booklet with the above title has just reached me: it is for the season 1928-29. It gives the official analyses of 369 samples of fertilizers taken from 54 firms all over Canada. One firm only is listed in P. E. I., and it is gratifying to find that their guarantee is confirmed by the official test, the percentage in most cases being a little over what is marked on the bag.

Insects Injurious to Crops

Economic entomology has made great progress in Canada since the Department of Agriculture at Ottawa under the direction of the Dominion Entomologist, began in 1922 a systematic study of the insects affecting farm crops. There are now on file records of more than 3,000 species of economic importance and each year sees the number increased. This survey of insect pests has as its object a complete and accurate record of their distribution, prevalence, food plants, and their natural enemies. During the growing season the Entomological Branch issues a Monthly review of its observations to entomologists, and others interested, throughout Canada. At the recent meetings of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, held at Des Moines, Iowa, the Dominion Entomologist stated: "Much progress has been made in assembling data regarding insect pests since the establishment of Insect Pest Surveys in the United States in 1921, and in Canada in 1922. The monthly summaries of insect conditions published in both countries have undoubtedly served a very useful purpose."

Clover and Grass Seed

The Markets Service states that shipments from the wholesalers to the retailers are now more or less general, and thinks that the lower prices are the result of a slowness in turnover. Considerable quantities of red clover, alsike and timothy are still in the growers' hands in the production districts; this and the low prices are the result of slowness in the export markets. As before stated there is a tendency among growers to carry over their seed to next year in the expectation that there will not be another good crop, and consequently that prices will be higher. Prices in the U. S. A. and in Europe, our principal export markets, are only about half what they were last year, but timothy is selling a little higher. One U. S. quotation is—red clover \$11, against \$17.65 a year ago; alsike \$10.60 as against \$19.25; and timothy \$3.25 as against \$3.05. Saskatchewan reports that the retail trade is placing orders with Toronto and Montreal houses on the basis of \$19 to \$21 per 100 lbs. red clover No. 1, \$17 to \$19 for No. 2; \$15.75 to \$18 for No. 1 Alsike, \$14.50 to \$16.50 for No. 2, Timothy No. 1, \$10.50 to \$10.75; No. 2, \$9.50 to \$9.75.

The Seed Growers' Association of Memramook, N. B., produced 2,396 lbs. of creeping Bent Grass Seed, grading 85 per cent. No. 1, and the remainder No. 2.
