OTTAWA, July 22—The department of trade and commerce will probably take action against certain Canadian shippers, based on complaints received from the old country that dried apples marked fancy evaporated have been found to contain seeds and cores below the top layer, which consisted of high class products.

BOSTON, July 22—Charles W. Piner of Dorchester was instantly killed and two other men and a woman were slightly hurt when the automobile in which they were riding ran over an embankment in order to avoid a fast-approaching train at what is known as the White Mountain crossing of the Boston & Maine Railroad, just above Rochester, N. H., early today. The car turned turtle when it dropped a distance of eight feet.

NEW YORK, July 23—A fruitless search of the morgues and hospitals in three cities for Miss Dorcas Trams Snodgrass, a beautiful girl whose disappearance without apparent cause Wednesday morning resembles the Dorothy Arnold case, ended today, leaving the detectives engaged as far from solving the mystery as when they were called in.

Like Miss Arnold, she was engaged to be married shortly. On the morning of her disappearance two friends saw and spoke to her, receiving a nod as the girl hurried by. This was in the Grand Central Station.

Miss Snodgrass stepped from a train which rolled into the Grand Central Station and all trace of her has since been lost. Since she came from Mount Vernon, N. Y., five years ago, she has made her home at Mount Vernon with her sister, Mrs. John L. Grider, who had been chief engineer of the newly completed Boston, Westchester & Mount Vernon Railroad.

On her twenty-fifth birthday, last October, she entered the training school for nurses in Mt. Vernon hospital. She became a nurse not from want of money, but from sheer love of nursing and a desire to know something of medicine. Her success was marked.

WASHINGTON, July 23—"I do not believe we should be given free tolls through the Panama Canal to our shipping, either coastwise or international," said Senator Percy of Mississippi. He added that he did not believe the Hay-Pauncefote treaty with Great Britain permitted the United States to discriminate against foreign shipping in the interest of American commerce.

Senator Percy said the neutrality of the Canal had been guaranteed by the United States in return for Great Britain's surrender of her protest rights against its fortification. He declared the United States could not claim under the British treaty the right to give favors to its own shipping, if such a provision had been made apart of the treaty, he said, it would have been instantly rejected by Great Britain.

"It has been said we cannot get a fair trial at the Hague Court," said Senator Percy. "If we were to present to any court the claim that we were entitled to these privileges under the treaty we could not escape the charge on the part of all nations that we were making a disruptive attempt to evade our just obligations." Senator Percy thought the United States enjoyed practically no privileges under the Hay-Pauncefote treaty which it did not have to share with the world.

OTTAWA, July 23—Weather conditions were not favorable for tree fruits. Somewhat hot and dry for small fruits during July.

Apples—Prospects have depreciated since last month. Nova Scotia expected only 52 per cent of a full crop.

Pears—Eastern Canada, medium crop only, British Columbia good.

Plums—Below medium in Eastern Canada, good in British Columbia.

Peaches—Notwithstanding the injuries resulting from the severe weather of last winter, a fair crop will be harvested in the chief commercial orchards.

Cherries—A fair crop of early cherries has been harvested; sweet cherries decidedly short.

Grapes—Good crop everywhere.

Small Fruits—Strawberries short in Eastern Canada and prices correspondingly high. Raspberries shortened by dry weather. Currants and gooseberries good, blackberries decidedly short. In British Columbia, small fruits have been a heavy crop.

Potatoes—Medium crop. Insects and Fungus Diseases—The ravages of the tent caterpillar caused much damage in New Brunswick, Western and Southern Quebec and Eastern Ontario, many of the orchards being completely defoliated. Apple scab is showing in District 6. Blight has done more than the usual injury in parts this season.

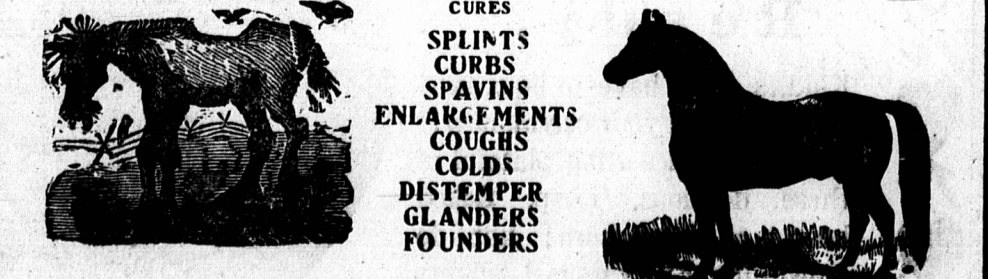
