**Train Arrangements Discussed at Board of Trade Meeting Last Night.**  
 A large meeting of the Summerside Board of Trade was held last night with Neil McQuarrie, K. C. in the chair. The visitors present were Hon. H. R. Emmerson, Minister of Railways; Mr. Butler, Deputy Minister of Railways; D. Pottinger, General Manager; E. Tiffin, General Traffic Manager; G. A. Sharp, Superintendent of the P. E. I. Railway and the most prominent business men of Summerside.

The President in a few well chosen remarks stated the object of the meeting and took up:  
 First, the question of better train arrangements. Quite a number spoke and showed the difficulty under which the people of Summerside labored. It was recommended that the Cape Traverse train be replaced.  
 Second, that the train which leaves here for the west at 10.05 be held till 11 p.m. so as to give the people from the west an opportunity to come down in the morning and do their business and return by the early afternoon train.

Hon. Mr. Emmerson stated that his purpose in coming here was to provide the best accommodation possible and he would endeavor to make such arrangements as would be pleasing to the people of Summerside and to the west.  
 The improvement of the railway station site was then discussed. The Minister with plan before him and with the suggestions that were offered went thoroughly into the matter but nothing definite was decided on.

A vote of thanks was then moved by J. H. Bell and seconded by Neil McLeod and unanimously carried to the Minister for his presence at the meeting to which he replied in fitting terms.
