JOHN A. GOULDROP, late of Providence, has been appointed manager of the Philadelphia store of the Columbia Phonograph Company. He was born in Tryon, and afterwards lived in Crapaud who was drowned at sea. The latter was an uncle of Dr. Schurman of Cornell and the subject of this sketch began his business career, at the age of seventeen years, as bookkeeper for a small ship builder. He gradually accumulated \$300 with which he came to New York and entered a business college, graduating at the head of his class and making nearly record percentage on final examinations. His first work in New York was with the old scale manufacturing house of John Chatillon & Sons. Later he was identified with hardware interests in New York and then, for five years, he traveled for the financial paper, the United States Investor. This work brought him into direct contact with men in all lines of business and gave him the best possible preliminary training for such managerial positions as the future might have in store for him. Mr. Gouldrop entered the service of the Columbia Phonograph Company in January, 1904. S. S. B. Campbell, now the manager of the New York store, was then at the head of the Installation Department, and under his supervision Mr. Gouldrop, cared for the accounts and reports. In April following, he was transferred to Philadelphia where he was soon made assistant manager. Eight months later he was appointed assistant manager of the New York store. In September, 1905, he was sent to Providence to open the store in that city. In whatever position Mr. Gouldrop has been placed he has invariably acquitted himself in a manner to earn promotion in a very short time. As an assistant under Mr. Campbell his work was so thorough and painstaking that it was quickly discovered that he could be of more value in the larger field that the Philadelphia store afforded and his success there led to his being recalled and placed in the still more important position of assistant manager of the New York store. When a thoroughly competent manager was needed for the new and important store at Providence Mr. Gouldrop was chosen, with the result that his management there has been so highly satisfactory that he has now been advanced to be manager of one of the largest and most important of the Columbia Phonograph Company's stores. Mr. Gouldrop's career in the service of the company is particularly interesting because it once more illustrates that when the men who enter that service possess the right qualifications, are imbued with the proper spirit and put their shoulders to the wheel in earnest, their advancement is not only sure but swift.
