2 cups flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 1/2 cups chopped figs.

English Cricket Played In India

LONDON, April 20—(By The Canadian Press)—Another of England's cricket children has now reached its majority—India. During the coming season a team composed of Hindus will tour England and play a series of games with the counties and picked sides.

The experiment has created a great deal of interest as it indicates the game has reached the same high level in India that it has in Australia, South Africa, New Zealand and the West Indies.

The cricket season formally opens on April 23 when all India will meet T. G. Scott XI at Pelsham Rye. Most of the counties come in to action the following day and begin their challenge for the championship, now held by Yorkshire.

England failed rather dismally in 1932 when the Australians made their last tour and recaptured the "ashes," mythical emblem of the cricket championship of the world. Perhaps England's
