MONTREAL, Dec. 30 (CP)—Butter and cheese prices swung upward in fairly active trading on open produce markets here today, the Dominion Department of Agriculture reported. Eggs fluctuated slightly while potatoes remained unchanged.

Cremaire butter prints to retailers were 22 1-2-23 cents a pound and solids 22-22 1-2. Western butter was unquoted. Gup. No. 1 pasteurized and whole sale jobbing lots sold at 21 1-4 for regraded.

Ont. white and colored sold for 11 1-2-5-8 cents a pound.

Graded egg shipments in used free cases were offered at 32-33 for A-large, 28 for A-medium 27 for A-pullets, B-large 24-24 1-2, B-medium 23 and 22 for C.

MINING

TORONTO, Dec. 30 (CP)—The stock market headed towards the year-end flying a bullish signal on volume pickup. All indices closed higher today and turnover at 647,000 shares was the heaviest of the week.

Gold and western oil issues especially displayed a strong edge, the metal group adding 1.10 to its index standing and the western oils added 1.14. Industrials were up .53 and the base metals .32.

Uchi and Siscoe were favorites among the golds and both held gains of 10 cents while trading in heavy volume. Issues of the group up 5 to 10 cents on smaller turnover included Little Long Lac Macassa, Macleod-Cockshuit, Kirkland-Hudson Bay, O'Brien Pickle Crow, Powell-Rouyn and Wright-Hargreaves.

Western oils slowed down after staging a strong second hour market and only part of the gains were held. Home touched 3.30 and closed at 3.20 for a net gain of 10 cents and other issues up 3 to 6 cents were Calgary-Edmonton, Calmont, Davies, Highwood, Sarcee and Okalta. Provinces closed with a gain of 17 cents and Dalhousie was down 8. Royalties fell 1-4.
