Hall, Richmond Street, and on receiving the officer's approval the advertisements can then be inserted in The Charlottetown Guardian.

Montreal Exchange

MONTREAL, Sept. 23 (CP)—Price adjustments were practically all upward in transactions today on the stock exchange and curb market. Gains were fractional in the main. In a stronger utility list, on the stock exchange advances were posted by Canadian, Winnipeg Electric "A", Canadian and Newfoundland. Alcan in industrials were asbestos, Canadian Car, Dominion Tar and Bauxite, Howard Smith was the lone exception among utilities which moved and registered a decline.

Canada Steamship common and preferred were firmer in early trading and C.P.R. also picked up a little profit. Imperial was out in front in oil. In banks, Royal was a point holder and Lake of the Woods and Alberta Grain preferred edged up in miscellaneous. Total sales: 16,000 shares; Industrials, 4,600; Mines, 11,400.

Toronto Exchange

TORONTO, Sept. 23 (CP)—Accounting for 39,700 shares of a total market turnover of 142,000, Ontario Nickel held the trading spotlight on the Toronto stock exchange. The issue's price got up to 13 1/2 and closed 1/2 higher at 13 1/4. A few other base metals followed. Ontario Nickel's upward trend, but the group showed a small dip in the indices.

White Amulet and Ventures each dropped 10 cents. Ona late deal, Chromium jumped 70 cents to 2.00. Western oils were slightly more active than usual with Ajax advancing 5 and Model losing a similar amount. The group as a whole was lower.

Gold and industrials were higher, continuing index rises which began two weeks ago. Changes continued to be narrow, however, with activity spread around. Best of the solids were Lake Shore up 25, Mining Corporation up 13 and Hollinger up 10. Pickle Crow, off 6 to 1.35, was at a new low for the year. Macassa was off 5 and Preston down 2.

Activity among industrials settled in on one place. Bell Telephone and Walkers gained a point each.
