The advance guard of the Chinese now occupy the garrison at Harbin.

## THE FUR MARKET

From the New York Fur Auction Sales Corp. Since our last report there has been a decided improvement noticeable in the fur market. To a great extent this is doubtless due to the increased consumption stimulated by the early winter weather which has prevailed throughout the country. Such improvement coming in the face of the campaign now being waged against the purchase of non-essential articles, supplies a definite answer to the manner in which furs are regarded by the consuming public. It is certainly true that in many parts of the country the use of furs are actually a necessity, and that in other centres where the winters are not so extreme the use of furs, if not an actual necessity is nevertheless not regarded as luxurious. In fact, the advance in prices of woolen cloth has brought garments of certain grades in close competition with the cloth article.

We cannot conceive that it is the purpose of the campaign so to discourage the purchase of non-essential articles already manufactured as to bring financial losses to many business concerns, with the resultant direct loss to the Government in the collection of taxes. We prefer to conclude that non-essential articles will be manufactured and sold so long as labor for such articles is not actually required for the manufacture of essential articles. Should manufactured furs of certain limited grades be regarded as non-essential, we believe that even then they will disappear from the market until the requisite labor is no longer available for their manufacture. As to this labor factor, there is as yet no shortage in the class of labor employed by the fur manufacturers and it is not likely that any large proportion of such labor will be useful or required in the manufacture of essential articles.

Reports from all sections indicate that a shortage exists today in almost all articles, particularly in red fox, muskrat, mink, marten and raccoon. Reports also show that this year's collection of skins is of unusual good quality, due doubtless to the protection afforded by the Game Laws of most fur-producing states and the especially favorable weather conditions. Taken in conjunction, it would seem therefore that the prevailing prices will probably be maintained even through a somewhat more restricted consumption should develop. The report further shows that fisher, especially the dark skins, the better grade and good quality cross fox, red fox, marten, American opossum, the heavy quality wild cat and better grades of wolf are in demand, while a strong speculative demand with an active market has developed among dealers for skunk, that coat stock raccoon, otter, beaver and muskrat are in strong demand.

and that an improved demand has sprung up for lynx, grey fox and white fox. The better-colored fresh mink skins are selling well as are ermine, Bear badger and blue fox are selling slowly. Silver fox are accumulating as a result of slower sales, with a tendency to increase sales at lower prices.

## PTE. D. A. GILLIS KILLED

Word has been received by Mr. Joseph Gillis of Indian River, that his brother Pte. Daniel A. Gillis has made the supreme sacrifice having died of wounds on Nov. 9th.

Pte. Gillis who is a son of the late Murdoch Gillis was born in Clemonville about 22 years ago. After leaving St. Dunstan's College about five years ago he went to Western Canada where he held a position with the Western Canada Saw Mills Co., of Saskatoon. In the spring of 1916 he gave up the position to enlist in the 196 Western Universities Battalion, after reaching France he was attached to a machine gun section in which he was serving when wounded. Another brother, Sebastian, has also enlisted and is now in England.

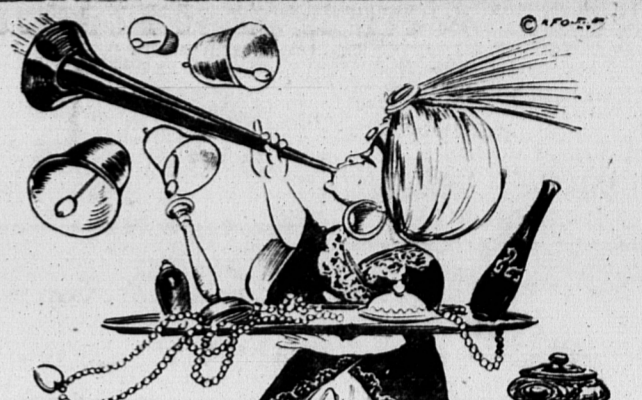
