New Post Office at Alberton.

Mr. R. A. Clarke, the postmaster of Alberton, has lately moved into the new post office, which is a vast improvement on the old one, and a model in arrangement, fittings and neatness. The building is 25 x 40 ft. Its interior is divided as follows: Entry, assorting room, money order office and private office. The entry which is 10 x 25 ft., runs across the entire end of the building. To the right, facing the door as you enter, is a door leading to the money order office. To the left is the entrance to the assorting room, while the intervening space is occupied by lock boxes, call boxes and delivery wicket. Along the top of the partition separating the entry from the rest of the building, are a number of glass panels. The money order office is quite private, being completely shut off from the entry. Leading off from the money order office is the private office of the postmaster. The whole of the interior is finished in wood, oiled and varnished. The woodwork is laid in panels and each panel is surrounded by a dark moulding. The building as a whole is well ordered, pleasing in appearance, well lighted and sanitary. Mr. Clarke deserves the thanks of the community for his enterprise in providing it with such a much needed public building.
