"WE LIVED LIKE KINGS" WRITES VANCOUVER MAN

Lieut. Maclean of McGill Contingent is now with Princess Pats he is a Prince Edward Island boy, and a son of the "Manse," being born while his father was minister of the congregation of Valleyfield, Prince Edward Island. He writes as follows:

"I am out of the trenches again and I am feeling fine. We were in without going out once for sixteen days. It surely was a long time, but we had very few casualties in all that time. I was in full charge of about a couple of hundred yards of our line most of the time as we did not have as many officers as there are usually. More have come up lately and it will be their work to see that everything is done."

The above is an extract from a letter written by Lieut. Maclean, who is now at the front to his mother, Mrs. K. B. Maclean, at Jubilee, Burnaby. Lieut. Maclean received his commission previous to his departure from this city on April 2 of last year with the McGill contingent, but since the amalgamation of the McGill contingent with the Princess Pats he has been acting-sergeant. Lieut. Maclean is well known in Vancouver, as he was for some time vice-principal of the Alexandra school.

Continuing his letter he says: "We had a line in a village and the trenches were good in most places, so that we had very little fixing to do with stoves, and we lived like kings. I felt the responsibility and we did not have a very necessary amount of good, quiet sleep, but we cannot complain of that as it is never a possibility in the trenches owing to so many patrols being necessary. That little town was a place of rust and rats of all kinds and a bit "crummy." The church was an absolute wreck. Lean, hungry, suspicious cats wandered among the ruins of their old homes. A young kitten who did not fear us wandered in and visited from one to another and grew very fat on the scraps we gave her. We left her there with the soldiers who relieved us."
