THE SEMLIN GOVERNMENT

Dr. R. E. McKeichine, of Nanaimo Chosen as a Member Without Portfolio

Premier Semlin was not able last evening, as had been expected, to announce the completion of his cabinet, although during the day it was given out that Dr. R. E. McKeichine, member elect for Nanaimo city, had been chosen as a member of the executive council without portfolio.

Dr. McKeichine was sworn in yesterday afternoon. It is understood that he preferred entering the cabinet without a portfolio, his position as colliery surgeon at Nanaimo making it impossible for him to undertake the management of a department.

Hon. R. E. McKeichine, M. D. is a native of Brockville, Ont., where he was born in 1861. His father was Major William McKeichine, who was connected with the Grand Trunk and Midland railways, and was afterwards superintendent of the Prince Edward Island railway during the McKenzie regime.
