Eight Survive Once Powerful "White" Tribe (G.P. Cable By Guardian's Special Wire) GEORGETOWN, British Guiana, May 13—Extinction is drawing near for the Waikali Indians, the Once-powerful race of "white" Indians who populated British Guiana's unexplored hinterland in thousands at one time. Back in the colony's wild southern region, the numbers of the tribe have been slowly dwindling until now there remain but eight survivors. The discovery was made by a survey party which is now demarcating the boundary line between British Guiana and Brazil for the British Guianan Government. Members of the party, pushing through dense jungle growths in a strange territory, came upon the tribe's remnants a few miles from the Brazil border. The handful of starved natives, grouped in a few huts, consisted chiefly of old men and women. Death was not more than a few years away for most of them, and to the explorers it appeared but a matter of time before the tribe would be totally extinct. Study of economic, social and political relations between Canada and the United States undertaken by the Carnegie Foundation will be made with the assistance of two Nova Scotians, Professor D. C. Harvey, Provincial Archivist and Dr. R. A. MacKay of Dalhousie University have been selected as members of one of the committees studying the relations.
