Mr. Haszard has completed his arrangements for illustrating Mr. Justice Fitzgerald's lecture upon Charlottetown in the olden days to be delivered in Kindergarten Hall next Monday under the auspices of the Natural History and Antiquarian Society. The sheet upon which Mr. Haszard will throw his views and portraits is 225 square feet in extent. This collection of views alone should attract a very large audience, but, in connection with so interesting a subject with Judge Fitzgerald as lecturer, it will doubtless prove one of the most attractive public events of the year.

For years Mr. G. Herbert Haszard has been collecting photographs of "Charlottetown of the Olden Time," including street scenes from the time when the old round market house stood where the Provincial Building now is down to the present; as well as portraits of most of our prominent citizens of those bygone days. These or as many of them as can be used on that occasion, with comments by Mr. Justice Fitzgerald, will be shown under the auspices of the Natural History and Antiquarian Society, in Kindergarten Hall on the evening of Monday, February 19th. Sabbath Schools in Scotland.

The decline in the attendance at the Sabbath school is attracting the attention of Christian workers in all parts of Scotland. One of the Highland ministers recently hinted his belief that the many divisions of the work for the young into Sabbath school, Bible classes, Guilds, and so on, was one cause for decreased attendance. Were the young people to attempt to attend all the organizations made in their behalf there would not be one night left that they might spend at home. Of course it is argued that but one of these is intended for any one class, but can you confine the ambition of a live boy or girl to but one class?

A member of the Established Church would meet the difficulty by insisting upon a more efficient teaching of Scripture truth in the parish schools. That is not the trouble. The lack of teaching in Scotland as in Canada is in the home. Till there is a reformation there all means to meet the difficulty met in retaining boys and girls in the Sabbath School will be more or less of a failure.
