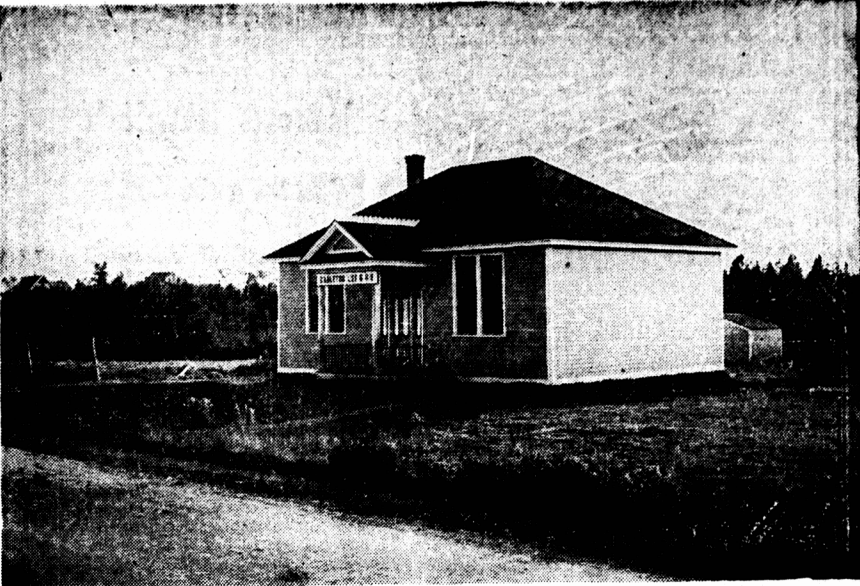

(1) Residence and barn of Mr. Robert S. Cousins, Darnley, winner of second year home competition for Prince County.



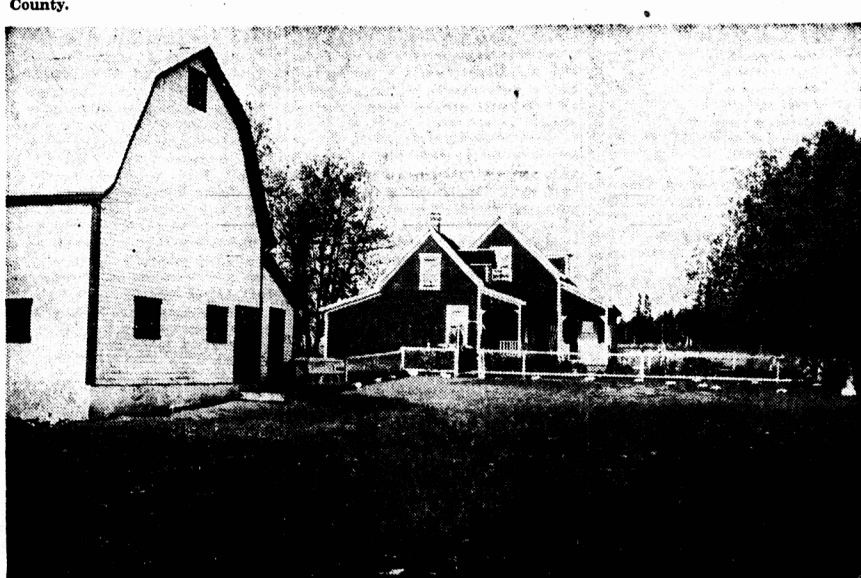
