CLOSING SESSION OF THE CONVENTION

Of the Baptists of the Maritime Provinces Held in the City—The Grand Ligne Mission—Excellent Report Submitted on Temperance.


The evening and closing session Tuesday opened with Scripture reading by Rev. J. C. Spurr and prayer by Rev. D. Long. Rev. E. J. Grant spoke of what the denomination owed to Home Missions. The Baptists now exceed any other evangelical denomination in the Maritime Provinces by 10,000 and it looks probable that in the near future they would have 40,000 more members. This came about because of Home Mission work. This work is related to the other work as the hen to the egg—the soil to the crop, the cause to the effect. The Home Mission fields supply men and money for the college. Fifty per cent of the young men at the college today have come from Home Mission fields. 12 ministers have been sent out from Margaree, a Home Mission field. He spoke of the need and asked for larger contributions. Rev. D. Hutchinson presented the report on Grand Ligne Missions. The report was on motion adopted. Mr. Hutchinson gave a stirring account of the trials of the early missionaries. The speaker gave some reasons for this mission: 1st. The great commission calls for the preaching of the gospel to all nations; 2nd. It preaches the gospel to all that believe it and stands for all that they stand for; 3rd. All Canadians should seek to produce the highest type of citizen throughout the Dominion, the Grand Ligne Mission is producing that type of men; 4th. It stands for a gospel that is light and life and strength to all who will receive it; 5th. Its work has resulted in great good. 6000 French Canadians have received an education there and some of these who went to New England have been the means of organizing Baptist Churches there. He asked for a generous large hearted support for this Mission.
Rev. W. T. Staehouze spoke of the mission work in the North West, of the enormity of the country, of the greatness of the responsibility of the nationality of the people. He mentioned some of the conditions that makes potent the appeal for aid that comes from the North West. The Baptist Ministers of the North West stand solid to a man in opposition to the Separate School System imposed upon the N. W. by the Roman Catholic hierarchy. The splendid results that have come from the labors of Baptists in the North West should encourage all to continued and renewed effort. For the future \$50,000 were needed. 75 men could be set to work as missionaries in the North West.

A resolution of sympathy was passed to Dr. Black in view of his physical disabilities.
Resolved that this convention reaffirm its unalterable adherence to the long Baptist principle of the separation of church and state and its unalterable antagonism to separate schools as a violation of that principle. Resolved further that the convention express its determination to aid in opposing by all legitimate means any and every attempt to extend the principle of separate schools in our fair Dominion.
The adoption of a Hymn Book was referred to a committee, after a discussion carried on by Burpee Witter, Rev. Ward Fisher, Rev. J. H. Jenner, Rev. H. G. Colpitts, Dr. Trotter, J. D. Ross, Nelson Smith.
It was resolved unanimously to accept the invitation of the Liverpool Church to the Convention to meet with them next year.
The report on Temperance written by Rev. H. B. Smith was read by Rev. J. H. McDonald. The liquor traffic has been demonstrated to be a deadly peril. War has killed its thousands, intemperance its tens of thousands. The struggle for the supremacy of temperance has been long and arduous but we firmly believe that unequalled victory will some day perch upon the banner of our noble cause. By those in authority many things have been interposed to check and delay the end for which we pray viz—Prohibition. Avowed prohibitionists have been gagged with portfolios, parliament has rolled Royal Commissions in our way, we have been fooled with pablicists, humbugged with promises and insulted with blank refusals. We have reached a period in the history of this struggle when we are no longer to content ourselves with fair promises and sweet smiles but to dare and do.
We heartily recommend that the burning sentiment be turned vigorously upon our enemy. We have no sympathy with a third party, but in the approaching election we recommend that the temperance electors in each political party demand that their candidates pledge themselves in favor of prohibition and we firmly believe that if this policy be maintained the issue will be all we pray for.
After finishing up some unfinished business the convention adjourned at 12:10 with prayer by Dr. Cohoon.
