Tragic Career of Father at 80

LONDON, Oct. 8.—Aged 80, and once a prosperous Saloon Keeper Israel Myers told a story of the ups and downs of life when he appeared at Old Bailey charged with receiving stolen goods. This was said to be the first time he had appeared in a criminal court.

His father, said his counsel, died when he was 17, and Myers took over his father's Saloon in the East-end, and, managing it successfully, brought up his ten young brothers and sisters.

After spending some time in America he returned with savings of \$7,500 bought a Saloon in Houndsditch. Nine years later he sold it for \$45,000 and retired. Then, Myers' counsel continued, the troubles began. His first wife died, he married again, but the second wife went off to America with another man, after robbing her husband of all he possessed. Myers had to start business all over, again. He became a jeweller, and in his extreme old age fell into the hands of a gang of burglars, who threatened to expose him if he did not continue to deal with them. He had married a third time, and had dependent upon him a young wife and two children, the younger being only three months old.

Saying that if there were no receivers burglars would have to shut up shop, the Recorder passed sentence of nine months in the second division.

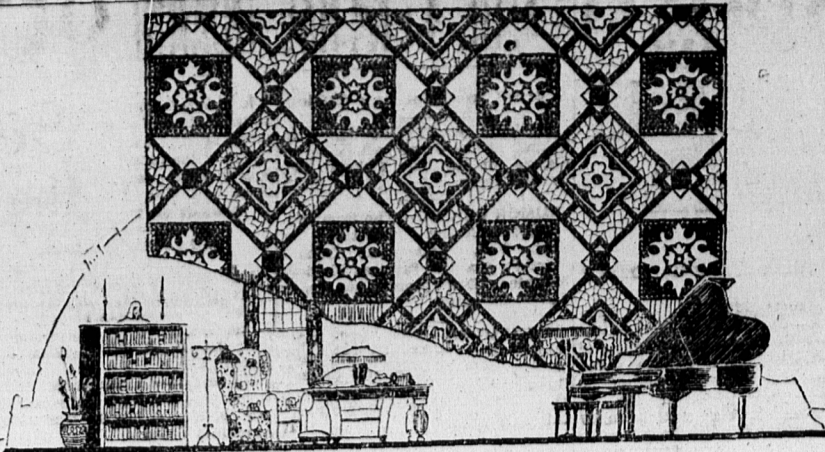
Noted Judge Drafts His Will Wrongly

LONDON, Oct. 5.—The Right Hon. John George Gibson, J. G. Colwyn Bay, Denbigh, for thirty-three years a Judge of the King's Bench in Ireland formerly Conservative M. P. for Liverpool Solicitor-General for Ireland, 1895-7 and Attorney-General 1887-8, who died on June 28, aged 77, brother of the first Lord Ashbourne left unsettled property in his own disposition of the gross value of £83,468, with net personality £53,118. He stated that he made his will owing to the change in his circumstances due to "having with deep regret quitted Ireland and finally decided to make England my home for the rest of my life, which cannot now, at my advanced age, be long," and he stated that he had satisfied all the claims of his Irish domestic staff by substantial payments in recognition of their long and faithful service (for which he expressed his gratitude), and he therefore did not repeat the legacies left to them by his earlier will.

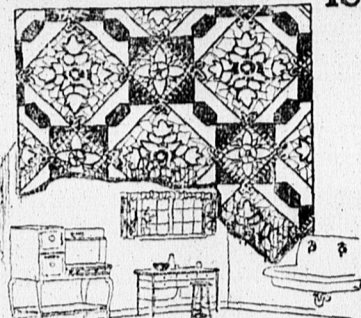
He left:— £100 to the Governing Body of the Portora Royal School, Enniskillen, "where my school life was spent," directing that this sum be invested "in permanent or durable British Government securities," and the income applied in providing annual prizes or medals for boys on the school roll, £100 to the Irish Bar Benevolent Society, Society, Ireland; £25 to the Clergy £50 to the Protestant Orphan Sons' Education Charity, Ireland, £200 to the Adelaide Hospital, Peterstreet, Dublin; £20 to the Dublin Working Boys' Home, and £20 to the Convallescent Home, Stillorgan, Co. Dublin. Like many other famous Judges and Lawyers, he failed to comply with the requirements of the law in his own will, and an affidavit of the execution was required before it could be admitted to probate.

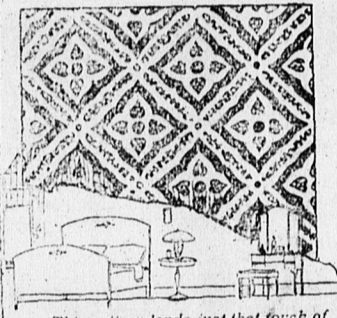


A nice pattern for the Living Room, one of the many attractive designs available in tasteful colorings

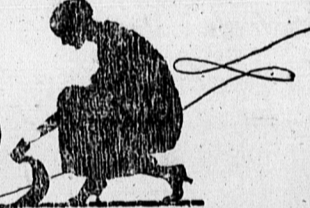
