Would Cut Use Of Recordings By Private Stations

(By D'Arcy O'Donnell)

OTTAWA, July 3—(SP)—Walter H. Murdoch, Canadian executive officer of the American Federation of Musicians, urged today that the CBO reduce the time radio stations are allowed to use recordings and asked that private radio stations spend five per cent of their gross revenue on the development of local talent.

Mr. Murdoch was one of two witnesses to appear before the committee. W. A. Cason of the radio division of the Transport Department took the stand after Mr. Murdoch was through to answer questions on a brief prepared by G.C.W. Browne, controller of radio in the Transport Department.

Mr. Murdoch said that in transcripts made for radio stations members of the Federation were paid \$1,334,467 and the royalties amounted to \$38,803.

The Federation said Mr. Murdoch was ready to give up making radio transcription because it believed that such a move would lead to more employment for musicians. A station could operate 17 hours a day on transcripts.

If transcripts were prohibited on the air listeners might not hear high paid talent but would hear local talent in which they were interested.

Rev. E. G. Hansell (SO-MacLeod) said the CBO received from the taxpayers about \$5,000,000 a year which private stations did not get and possibly for that reason the CBO was able to spend more for the development of talent.

Mr. Murdoch said that whatever the circumstances private stations, with few exceptions, were not developing local talent or giving employment to professional musicians.
