RICH PRIZES FOR DARING DEEDS OF FRENCH AVIATORS

PARIS, Aug. 8.—Andro Michlinone, one of the strongest supporters of aviation, has offered \$200,000 in prizes for noble deeds of French aviators without distinction of rank. The first prize is \$20,000.
The awards will be made by a committee consisting of officers appointed by President Poincare, members of the Aero club and a committee of the Aeronautic League, with Senator Raymond as president. If a hero is killed his family is to receive an award.
A Figaro despatch from Brussels states that five German aviators were killed by the fire of the civil guard. Also Lieutenant Forstner, author of the Zabern incident was captured.
