### JUSTICE TO THE MAGISTRATE.

A few days ago a letter was printed in The Guardian over the signatures of Revs. A. D. McLeod and D. McLean and Mr. Costain criticising the administration of the Prohibitory Law in West Prince and by implication charging the Stipendiary Magistrate with wilfully favoring the violators of the law, also demanding answers to certain questions they propounded. A well-known temperance man of West Prince writes in regard to the criticism and questions referred to: "I regret the course these gentlemen are taking, as I am quite sure that Mr. Tweedy is doing his duty strictly as a Magistrate ought to do. These people ought to know that the Magistrate's duty is limited to the issue of documents and the giving of judgments according to the law and the evidence produced by both parties to the suits before him. They seem to think that the Stipendiary is appointed for the sole purpose of stamping out the illicit traffic in whiskey. They forget that he is appointed to sit in judgement without partiality and that the Government has its representatives in their Inspectors whose duty it is to chase the violators.

"Mr. Tweedy, as far as I have had opportunity of knowing has given judgments strictly in accordance with the law and the evidence and of course feels keenly the unjust criticism of the parties mentioned. With regard to the dignity of his position debars him from replying through the press. The Magistrate, as you know, makes his returns to the Provincial Department of Justice and cannot be expected to answer people's questions whenever they choose to fire them at him through the papers."

Referring to the above we desire to say that The Guardian only knows the manner in which Mr. Tweedy performs his duties by being informed from those who are in Alberton and the vicinity. We greatly regret if in publishing the letter of the clergymen above named any injustice has been done to the Magistrate and cheerfully publish the above testimonial in his favor. Where such broad differences of opinion exist in regard to a matter of this character it would seem to be desirable that the friends of prohibition should consult together and agree among themselves before rushing into print.

Mr. Brodeur appears to have been the only Minister who took part in the discussion of our Island grievances on Monday last, and he apparently thinks his Government is not only just but generous toward Prince Edward Island! Such justice and generosity are quite overwhelming!

### FUNNY MR. BRODEUR.

A despatch to The Patriot tells that in discussing Island affairs Hon. Mr. Brodeur severely censured the dialogal sentiments expressed by an Island newspaper. He regretted that there should be such sentiments anywhere, and so on. We sincerely hope that Mr. Brodeur's much more important colleague, the Minister of Finance was absent at the time, for if present, such language might recall to his mind the awful depravity of those twenty-five years in which he labored to get Nova Scotia out of the union. Also we most sincerely hope that Mr. Brodeur avoided any allusion to his own family record after making his speech, for obvious reasons.

The real humor of Mr. Brodeur was however most strikingly displayed when at a later stage he informed the House that "it was a Liberal Government that gave the first winter steamer to the Island, and that there have been no complaints this year about the winter service." If he had only added a few words about the splendid performances of the Montcalm and the Lady Grey! When Mr. Brodeur undertakes to speak of what he knows nothing the extent of his lack of knowledge and his misinformation is of almost continental area.

The Opposition Leader, Mr. Borden declares that the bond of union with Prince Edward Island has not been carried out, and that the cost and feasibility of a Tunnel ought to be looked into by the Government. If continuous communication cannot be otherwise maintained, he declares the Tunnel should be faced without delay. "Sir Wilfrid Laurier, it seems, sat silent through the discussion in which all the Island members and three or four others took part.
