KILL WORMS IN FOWLS

Worms affect chickens by using the food contents intended for the fowl and injure the internal organs so they cannot perform their proper functions. If chickens are affected with worms they are not nourished properly, no matter how well fed. The fowls affected with worms will become lighter in weight and will have ravenous appetites all the time. At feeding time the fowls will feed greedily, but quit eating in a short time.

Here is a mixture that may be given to the flock in the feed both as a preventive and as a cure for worms:

- Magnesium sulphate... 10 parts Magnesium oxide... 2 parts Sulphate of iron... 2 parts Flowers of sulphur... 2 parts Ground ginger... 2 parts One rounded tablespoonful of a mixture is added to every gallon of the mash fed to the chickens.

When seriously affected with worms the fowls stand in a drawn-up position and they move in a very unsteady manner, without the elastic step of a healthy bird.

Many fowls in pens are fed an unbalanced ration. The lack of a proper food supply will produce a weakened condition. This is favorable to the development of worms.

Magnesium sulphate—Epsom salts—acts on the intestines, magnesium oxide on the kidneys, and sulphate of iron on the blood.

Sulphur is a stimulant for all of the organs. Three of the ingredients of the mixture contain some form of sulphur. As sulphur is one of the best insecticides and known fungicides, it is evident that it does its part in the destruction of the worms.

This compound acts on all parts of the fowl. It is therefore good for all ailments, including colds and roup.

It is not a good plan to give medicine to fowls unless they need it.—Farm and Fireside.

TORONTO, March 13th 1916

BEEPHIDES are unchanged, Tanners object to paying present prices for late take off, as the quality is becoming poor and they do not wish long haired or grubby stock except at a material reduction in price. City Butcher Hides green flat 18 1/2c per lb. Country Hides, green 16 to 16c per lb. flat cured, 17 to 17 1/2c. Part cured, 14 1/2c to 17c per lb.

CALFSKINS are steady and in good demand. City skins green, flat, 18c per lb. Country cured, 20 to 21c per lb. Part cured 18 to 19c per lb. Deacons or job Calf according to condition and age off \$1.10 to \$1.50 each.

HORSEHIDES are in fair demand at unchanged prices. City take off \$5.00 to \$5.50. Country take off No. 1 4.75 to \$5.50, No. 2 \$3.70 to \$4.50.

SHEEPSKINS are in good demand and are being marketed freely. City sheepskins \$2.00 to \$3.00. Country sheepskins 85c to \$1.00.

TALLOW is firm, the demand being good for all grades. City rendered tallow in barrels, 8c. Country stock, solid in barrels, No. 1 7 1/2c, No. 2 7c to 7 1/2c. Cake No. 1 8 to 8 1/2c, No. 2 7 to 7 1/2c.

HORSE HAIR is coming to market in large supply and is being absorbed at current quotations. Farmer Pedlar Stock 37 to 40c per lb.

WOOL is in good demand at unchanged prices. Washed fleece wool as to quality 45 to 47c per lb. Unwashed ejektions, (burry, coated, chaffy, etc.) 35 to 37c. Unwashed fleeco wool as to quality 31 to 35c. North-western unwashed according to quality 23 to 33c.

OLD HUBBERS, JUNK, ETC., are in better demand for some articles and bring slightly higher prices. Rubber Boots and Shoes according to trim 7 to 8c. Auto tires 5 to 6c. Bicycle tires 2 to 3c. Lead, heavy 3 1/2 to 4 1/2. Tea Lead 3 to 4 1/2c. Brass, heavy 7 to 8c. Light 5 to 7c. Copper, heavy 10 to 12c. Light 8 to 10c. Zinc 8 to 8c.

There is no change in the fur market, and trappers are disposing of their catch while prices are good, as there is bound to be a lower range of prices when the rubber, shedding, faded and springskins come to market.

The past season has been very satisfactory to the manufacturers and retailers and they are encouraged to go ahead with their sample lines to care for next seasons business.
