TWO DIVORCES GRANTED TO-DAY. FREDERICTON, Dec. 17.—Justice McKeown, Judge of the Court of Disputed Matrimonial Causes, this morning delivered judgment in two cases tried at the last term of the court. In both instances His Honor granted an absolute divorce to the complaining party.

In William J. Buchanan vs. Isabel Buchanan, both parties were born in Kings County, the defendant's maiden name being Isabel Parlee. They were married at Sussex in September, 1890, by Rev. Henry W. Little. After the marriage ceremony the parties lived together and two children were born to them. His Honor, after reciting the facts adduced in evidence, said in conclusion that he felt compelled to find as a fact that the defendant had been guilty as charged and the complainant was entitled to the divorce sought for. Messrs Fowler and Freeze represented the plaintiff in the case. J. D. McPadzen filed an appearance on behalf of the defendant, but at the hearing withdrew and the case was heard as an undefended case. John Alfonso Stratton vs. Maud Mary Stratton. The parties were married at Chipman, Queens County, in 1896, and after living together about six years, the husband produced evidence at the hearing to show that his wife then became unfaithful and went to live with a man named James Lemon. The testimony, His Honor said, was uncontradicted and he was compelled to grant the prayer of the

petitioner. The case was undefended. John R. Dunn represented the plaintiff, but at the trial F. H. Peters conducted the proceedings on behalf of Mr. Dunn. At the conclusion of the delivery of judgments the court adjourned sine die.

UNEASINESS FOR SAFETY OF FREIGHTERS. NEW YORK, Dec. 17.—There is grave uneasiness in shipping circles for the safety of ten large freight steamers, now overdue in Atlantic passages. In each case, very high rates are being asked for reinsurance. The last of the overdue ships is the

longest posted since 1899. All ten of the missing vessels left port toward the end of last month and are known to have encountered violent weather. Each carries a crew of from 30 to 40 and the value of ships and cargo totals nearly \$3,500,000.

Among the overdue ships are the Whitinham, 3,750 tons, which left Baltimore for Rotterdam on November 20; the Briester, 3,700 tons, which passed Newport News on November 25; from Galveston for Dun kirk, the Snowdon Range, 3,000 tons, which left Philadelphia on November 23; for Leith, and the Barbara, 3,700 tons, which left Newport News on November 22 for Naples.
