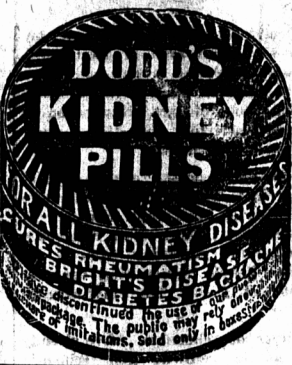
The eastern train arrived at Summerside last night at 6.45.
