Stocks Stage Upward Surge In Montreal

MONTREAL, April 10—(CP)—The Montreal Stock Exchange list closed out the week Saturday with a strong upward surge that carried some issues as much as a couple of points higher. Volume was heavy for the short session. Strength in rails was a feature. National Steel Car swung up 2 1/4 points at 36 3/4 and Canadian Car and Foundry common and preferred moved up about a point each. Canadian Pacific advanced 5-8. Papers joined the recovery with St. Lawrence paper preferred about three points higher. Construction were buoyant. Steel of Canada gained two points. Foundation 1-2 and Canada Cement and Dominion Bridge 1-2 each. In the miscellaneous section Dominion Steel and coal "B" gained a point. Sales: Industrials, 29,600; mines 56,900; bonds \$1,300.

Wide Recovery Trend On New York Exchange

BY FREDERICK GARDNER Associated Press Financial Writer NEW YORK, April 10—(AP)—Stocks whirled upward in Saturday's market for the widest recoveries witnessed in five months, leaders climbing 1 to more than 6 points. The Associated Press average of 60 issues retained a net advance of 2.1 points at 39 9/16. It was the largest upturn for any day since Nov. 10 last. On the week, the average was up 3.5 points, the best six-day performance since early in January. The turnover for the two hours amounted to 1,414,480 shares compared with 803,850 a week ago and was the greatest for any Saturday since Oct. 23. Owing to the earlier slowdown, the week's total volume was about 3,000,000 shares under the week before.

International Nickel led a general upturn among Canadian stocks up 2 1/4 at 46. Dome improved 1 5/8 to 50 and Walkers gained 1 5/4 at 37. Distillers-Peragrams, Ford, Hollinger, Lake Shore and Massey Harris were steady with McIntyre easing. An exception on the forward tick was Columbia gas which, as the second most active stock of the day, dropped 3-4 to 5 3/4 as the securities and exchange commission refused permission for company to pay a dividend on the common over the surplus account. Approval, however, was given for payments on preferred and preference shares.

Grain

WINNIPEG, April 10—(CP)—New crop wheat, export sales estimated at 650,000 bushels gave the October Winnipeg wheat future leadership in an irregular session Saturday. Profit-taking forced the May option down 1 1/2 cents and July lost an earlier cent advance. At the final bell prices were 1-2 lower to 1-4 cent higher, May 3 25 3/4, July 1 13 3/4-7-8 and October 91 cents. Most of the buying appeared to come from overseas interests which also accounted for purchase of 100,000 bushels of old crop supplies for shipment from seaboard. Cash wheat dealings were slow. Spreads on Nos. 1 and 2 northern eased 2 and 1 cent, respectively, at 18 and 8 cents premium above the May future. At the end of the listless session, coarse grain futures were: Oats 1-2 lower to 1-4 higher; barley 1-8 lower to unchanged; flax unchanged, and rye 1-4-1-2 higher.

GOVERNMENT QUIBBLING OVER TRIFLES

SANDERSON Canadian Press Staff Writer OTTAWA, April 7—The Federal Government is quibbling over trivial constitutional points while its revenue field or relieve them of bankruptcy or verging on bankruptcy, Hon. H. H. Stevens (Recon. Kootenay East) charged today in the House of Commons. Anticipable relief costs have placed Canadian towns and cities in their financial plight and there are only two alternatives open—widen their revenue field or relieve them of unemployment burdens, he said. Instead of going to the root causes of distress in Canada, debt and taxation, parliament has been drifting along.

Speaking in the debate on unemployment policies, he laid down a many-sided attack on Liberal action and plans. Canadian municipalities are being forced to the wall, Mr. Stevens claimed. This had a distressing effect on Canadian cities, he said, as was demonstrated two months ago with a Canadian loan floated on the London market for \$10,000,000 (\$50,000,000). "It ought to have been snapped up quickly," he continued. "But what happened? It hung fire for a week or 10 days and then the underwriters took half of it."

"Unless some step is taken here, there will be very serious times ahead for Canadian cities," he warned. There was not a major city in the country that was not a disgrace to Canada in regard to a large part of the down-town districts and the older sections in regard to housing. "It will take us 30 years to build up cities of Canada to decent level construction," Mr. Stevens continued. "The Minister of Labour says the municipalities are responsible and he will deal with them only through the provinces. The Minister and his colleagues will have to face this question sooner or later. They have failed to face it in the last two years, and now they are very decently to have a housing commission."

The former Conservative at one point was asked what he had done about housing, municipal financing
