FUNERAL AT YORK—The funeral of the late Frederick McDonald, 82, Avars, was held yesterday afternoon with a short service being held at his late residence followed by a service at York United Church conducted by Rev. ISLAND COAL PROBLEM—Coal will be scarce again in Prince Edward Island this winter, states Mr. L. B. MacMillan, solid fuels administrator for the Province. Supply is not coming in as quickly as desired. Mines in the Maritimes are behind in production and there will be very little United States coal available. There will be less anthracite procurable than in 1939. The problem is accentuated by the fact that more coal is being used in rural areas than in previous years. The airports, however, will not draw nearly as heavily on the supply this winter, and in Charlottetown the Maritime Electric Company's power plant is being changed over for oil consumption, which will mean an extra 9,000 or 10,000 tons available for other consumers. Mr. MacMillan states that the Royal Commission on coal, which is touring Canada, will be in Charlottetown about the middle of September. The commissioners are Justice Carroll, Justice McLoughlin, Messrs. R. D. Howland, A. J. Morrison and J. J. Frawley, K. C.

IN MEMORIAM

MRS. LEO GREENAN
Four years of illness borne in a remarkably cheerful manner came to an end in the Provincial Sanatorium on July 10th, 1945, when God called to Himself Mrs. Leo Greenan (nee Doris McCarville) at the early age of twenty-six years. Doris was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Phonus McCarville, South Freetown, where she received her early education in a fine Christian home. In 1937 she graduated in Commerce from Notre Dame Academy, Charlottetown. For two years she worked as stenographer in the store of Peters and Gallant, Rustico, where her efficiency and sociability made her a highly appreciated member of the staff. She was married in January, 1941, but after only a few short months of happiness she became ill and went to the Provincial Sanatorium for treatment. There she endeared herself to all the patients who associated with her, for her hope and gaiety were quite undaunted by even the greatest trials of her illness. Her devoted faith in God's Providence and her constant spirit of prayer kept her smiling bravely in the face of the pain she had to undergo from worrying over her illness. For a long time they hoped for her recovery, but early this year she began to fail rapidly, and fortified by the last rites of the Catholic Church she faced the end with a noble courage that can come only from the consciousness of being near to God and the trusting faith that death is the beginning of a happy eternity with Him in Heaven. She leaves to mourn, besides her beloved husband, her devoted parents, three brothers, Gerald in the Army, Leslie at home, and Celestine, a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, and two sisters, Eunice, Mrs. Justin McIvor, and Florence, Mrs. Roy Stackhouse. All were fortunately able to be home at the time of her death and funeral. One of her brothers, Elmer, predeceased her by five years. Her death was held on Friday, July 13th to St. Malachy's Church, Kinkora, where a Requiem High Mass was celebrated by Rt. Rev. James M. Murphy, D.P., of St. John's, and Percy Murphy, Gordon Hamill, Gordon Constable, Alfred Reeves, Carlyle Deighan acted as pallbearers. The large crowd of kind neighbors and friends which filled the church gave ample evidence of the esteem in which she was held, and the great number of beautiful floral tributes, messages and spiritual offerings, and messages of sympathy received were a mute testimony of the sympathy felt for those bereaved of the death of one so dearly loved.
