W. C. T. U. RESOLVES

Heartily Endorsing Provincial Prohibition.

THE CIGARETTE LAW

Is Praised—Sabbath Desecration Condemned—Hearty Thanks to All.

The Committee on Resolutions submitted the following report which was unanimously adopted at the Provincial W. C. T. U. held in this City:

We gratefully acknowledge God's goodness to us for the blessings of the past year and the way in which He has led us since our organization as a Provincial Union, and pray that His blessing may rest upon us yet more abundantly in the years to come.

Whereas, The Legislative Assembly of this Province at its recent session passed a bill prohibiting the sale of intoxicating liquors;

Resolved, that this W. C. T. U. Convention express its appreciation of the action of the Government and rejoice in the determined efforts being put forth for the enforcement of the law, and would assure them of our full sympathy and hearty co-operation in the same.

That we express our gratitude for the law enacted for the suppression of the sale and use of cigarettes and urge the great necessity of watchfulness by teachers and parents in the interests of young people generally.

Whereas many of the druggists of our Province are frequently violating the Sunday Act pertaining to druggists' sales on that day, by selling cigars, cigarettes, tobacco and other unnecessary articles;

Resolved, that we deem this breach of the law injurious and demoralizing, and would strongly urge the enforcement of that Act in reference to the same.

Resolved, that Local Unions urge upon school trustees, in employing teachers to give preference to those who are free from the alcohol and tobacco habits.

Resolved, that we acknowledge the good work done by our organ, "The Woman's Journal" and that we work energetically to make it still more efficient; we also recommend the Union Signal as very helpful to White Ribboners.

Whereas, the Lord's day is a precious gift from God to be used for our good;

Resolved, that Provincial W. C. T. U. is in hearty sympathy with all efforts for the enforcement of laws against the desecration of the Sabbath and while our ministers are earnestly presenting the importance of the careful observance of the Sabbath we urge Local Unions to cooperate with them in this end.

That we urge the local Superintendent of Mother's Meetings to make the teaching of purity in the home the special theme for the coming year as the surest foundation for purity in social circles.

Resolved, that we express our gratitude and appreciation of the faithful work done by Miss Henderson in acting as Rec-Secretary pro tem. That this convention place or record its indebtedness to her.

When Lord Robert entered Pretoria he found awaiting him as a prisoner an almost unknown woman who has since come into a world-wide fame. Mrs. Louis Botha, the lady in question though as pronouncedly in sympathy with the Boers as anybody in the Transvaal, is an Irish lady, the great-grand niece of Robert Emmett, the ill-fated Irish "patriot." The name of that ill-starred ancestor she bore until she married Louis Botha. She has been one of the most beautiful women in the Transvaal, and though now the mother of a numerous family, is still a very charming and comely little lady. She is a highly cultured woman, well read, musical, artistic bent, and in times of peace, a most successful and popular hostess. Those who knew the Bothas at home before the war began, describe the family as being in habits and tastes very similar to a good class English country family. Mrs. Botha knows England and the English well. She was there a couple of years ago, and has relatives in London. When entertained at dinner by Lord Roberts she suggested that feminine influences would be necessary to bring peace to Africa, and her recent efforts to cause a cessation of the war prove that she is as practical in diplomacy as she is apt in pointing a way.

AUCTION OF ADELINA PATTI'S CASTLE.

At the auction of Adelina Patti's Welsh castle the property was bought in by the auctioneer, the reserve price of £50,000 not being reached. A bluff bid of that amount was made, but the bidder said he did not mean his offer to be taken seriously.
