More Accidents From Icy Streets

The icy condition of the streets was the cause of three more car accidents in the City on Saturday, thus bringing the total number of accidents which have been reported to the City Police since Friday to seven. The first accident occurred about 11 a.m. when a car going north on Great George Street and a car travelling west on Easton Street collided at the intersection of the two streets. The first car was driven into a stop sign on the corner of Elm Avenue and Easton Street, breaking off the sign. Slight damage was caused to both cars. The second accident took place at the intersection of Weymouth and Kent Streets about 1.50 p.m. when a car travelling north on Weymouth and a truck proceeding east on Kent, collided. Damage to the left front door and the rear vision mirror was caused to the car, while the truck received damage to its radiator, grill, bumper, right front fender and headlight.
