MESSENGER AND VISITOR—In last week's Messenger and Visitor reference was made to the former meeting in Charlottetown of our Maritime Convention. It was suggested that the personnel of the present convention would be changed from that of 1887. If some of those present on that former occasion are in attendance this year (as doubtless some are) they will not only observe that the Convention is different, but that Charlottetown is different. There has been progress in this capital city, of Prince Edward Island in these eighteen years. One visiting Charlottetown for the first time is impressed with the compactness of the city and the regularity of its streets. The town was evidently laid out in the first place with a view to its growth and financial advancement. A beautiful park adorns the centre of the city in the midst of which are placed the public buildings, viz., the Court House, the Provincial Government Buildings, the Post Office and the City Market. The last named was built only a year ago and in beauty of architectural design would be a credit to any city. The business of the city generally is done also here at the centre of three sides of the public square which as before stated encloses the public buildings. On these streets are to be found mercantile establishments which for size and general up-to-date appearance would be worthy of a city of two or three times the size of Charlottetown. The civic pride that is taken in this capital of the province is very manifest as one walks about the square and along the well kept streets. The general aspect of things is the more interesting when one remembers that the entire population of the island is only one hundred thousand. The church buildings of Charlottetown are also quite in harmony with the general appearance of thrift that the city presents. Not the least attractive of these in respect to beauty of design and substantiality is the Baptist church in which the Convention is held.

The trustees of the new consolidated school, Hopewell Hill, N. B., who recently advertised for tenders for the driving of the school vans, have given yearly contracts for the different routes as follows: Hill route, 2 1/2 miles, fifteen children, to Byron A. Peck, for \$187; Chester route, 3 miles, twelve children, to Edmund Kinzie, \$205; Beaver Brook, five miles, twenty-five children, to Malcolm B. Stuart, \$340; Midway route, 6 1/2 miles, thirty children, to Edward Kinzie, for \$400. During the past two years D. P. Irving M. L. A., Vernon River, has been experimenting with Alfalfa along the same lines as a number of prominent farmers and agriculturalists in Prince County including Rev. A. E. Burke, Alberton who has given considerable attention to this stock feed. Mr. Irving is highly pleased with the results of his experiments and feels certain that Alfalfa can be successfully and profitably grown in this province. The Guardian yesterday was shown by him some specimens of last year's and this year's seedlings. That of last year measured 30 inches in the first cutting and the second cutting 30 inches. This year's seedling was sown on June 23rd and measured 20 inches. All the specimens had a splendidly vigorous growth and gave assurance that this clover can be profitably cultivated on Prince Edward Island. Mr. Irving's field came up a little thin last year but stood the frost well and this year showed an excellent growth. The specimens referred to above can be seen at this office by any interested in this branch of agriculture.
