MEETING OF THE P.E.I. PRESBYTERY

At Charlottetown, and within St James' Hall there on Tuesday, November 8th, 1908 and at 2:30 o'clock p. m. which place and date the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island met and was constituted. Mr. W. H. Spencer moderator pro tempore with whom were present Messrs J. W. McKenzie, T. F. Fullerton, A. Craze, R. G. Sinclair, E. J. Rattee, W. A. Mason, E. Smith, A. D. Sterling, S. D. McPhee, R. G. Strathie, A. Gray, W. A. McKay, A. B. McLeod, ministers. Daniel McDonald, T. C. James, J. J. McLeod, D. McInnis, Angus McPhee, Charles McKinnon, and Daniel McLean, elders. Minutes of meetings held on August 7th, 15th, and 28th, October 3rd, 4th, 25th, were read and sustained. Revs. P. K. McRae and A. McLean Sinclair, being present were invited to sit and correspond. The clerk stated that he had cited the session and congregation of Murray Harbour South to appear for their interests at this meeting in connection with the call from Riverside N. S. to Mr. S. D. McPhee. Mr. T. F. Fullerton intimated that he moderated in the call at Belfast on the 8th day of October, last, that the call came out unanimously in favor of Mr. S. D. McPhee, that it was signed by 229 members and 224 adherents and accompanied by a guarantee of \$800 stipend with use of manse and globe. The conduct of the interim moderator was sustained. Commissioners from Belfast, viz, Messrs D. A. McLeod and R. E. McDonald were then heard and the call was sustained as a regular Gospel call. Mr. Angus McPhee represented the session and congregation of Murray Harbour South. On Motion both calls were placed in the hands of Mr. McPhee, and the one from Belfast accepted by him. Presbytery agreed to grant the translation, and expressed sympathy with the congregations of Murray Harbour South and Riverside, N. S. Mr. A. Gray was appointed interim moderator of the session of Murray Harbour South and instructed to declare the pulpit vacant as soon as possible after the translation takes effect. It was decided that the induction of Mr. McPhee into Belfast take place there on Tuesday the 27th day of November instant at 11 o'clock a. m. the moderator of Presbytery to preside and induct, Mr. A. Gray to preach. Mr. R. G. Sinclair to address the minister and Mr. W. H. Spencer the people. Serving of the edict was left in the hands of the interim moderator. Presbytery agreed to meet on the same day (Nov. 27th) in St Andrews Church, Orwell, at 2:30 o'clock p. m. for the ordination and designation of Mr. M. Michael; the moderator of Presbytery to preside, ordain and designate. Mr. S. D. McPhee, to preach, the minister, and Mr. W. H. Spencer the people. Serving of the edict was left in the hands of the interim moderator of Orwell session. Mr. R. G. Sinclair stated that he moderated in a call at Valleyfield on the 25th day of September last, that the call came out heartily in favor of Mr. Luchlin Beaton, Moose Creek, Ontario, that it was signed by 224 communicants and 88 adherents, and accompanied by a guarantee of \$800 stipend with the use of manse and globe. The conduct of the moderator was approved. Messrs Charles McKinnon and Angus McDonald, commissioners from Valleyfield were heard in support of the call, which on motion was sustained as a regular Gospel call. The clerk was instructed to forward the same to the clerk of the Presbytery of Glenegony. Mr. William A. Morrison, Dalhousie Mills, was appointed to represent the session and congregation of Valleyfield and the Presbytery of P. E. I. before the Presbytery of Glenegony. Mr. T. C. James read the report on Presbytery Fund, which on motion was received and considered. It was decided that congregations be asked to contribute towards the fund an amount equal to one half per cent. of the total stipend received by their minister from all sources, and to forward the same to the clerk who was appointed treasurer of the fund. It was moved, seconded and carried that henceforth the minister of each seditary of Presbytery be read at the following seditary. The committee on the rearrangement of congregations reported and recommended as follows: 1. That the congregation of Richmond Bay East and West be consolidated. This recommendation was adopted. It was decided that a Presbytery meeting be held at Tyne Valley on Wednesday the 14th day of Nov. instant at 3 o'clock p. m. and that the session and congregations of Richmond Bay East and West be cited to show cause, if any, why this consolidation should not take place; 2. That Alberton, Montrose and Tignish, with manse at Alberton, be one congregation; 3. That Elmstale, Bloomfield and O'Leary be one congregation; 4. That West Cape, Brae, Campbellton and Mininigh be one congregation. These recommendations were endorsed by Presbytery. It was agreed that a Presbytery meeting be held at O'Leary on Thursday the 15th day of Nov. instant at 9 o'clock a. m. and that all these sessions and congregations be cited to appear at said meeting to show cause if any, why these recommendations, adopted by Presbytery, should not take effect. 5. That New Glasgow, Cavendish, Stanley and Beaulieu be one congregation. 6. That Brookfield, Hunter River and Clyde River be one congregation. These recommendations were also adopted, the organization to take effect on and after the 25th day of Nov. instant. 7. That elders who are active members of session are hereby declared to be elders of the session to which their session is transferred—Presbytery adopted this recommendation also.
