**Livestock**

MONTREAL, July 2—(CP)—There were 531 cattle, 191 sheep and lambs, 422 hogs and 999 calves for sale on the two Montreal markets today. Cattle were very slow, calves 50 cents to \$1 lower, lambs easier, hogs firm.

There were 350 cattle held over from Monday. Mostly medium good to good steers, these were not moving. A few canners, cutters and common to medium cows were sold at \$3.50 to \$6. Common bulls were \$4.50 to \$5.50.

Calves moved slowly at 50 cents to \$1 lower than Monday. Good quality veals were quoted at \$9 to \$9.50 with an odd top up to \$10. Medium kinds from \$8 to \$8.50 and common light veals down to \$7. Drinkers ranged from \$5 to \$6.50, mostly \$5.50 to \$6. Grassers \$3.50 to \$4.50.

Lambs were again lower. Good lambs were \$11 to \$12. Buck lambs were cut \$1 per cwt, mostly \$1 for B-1 alive fed and watered and up to \$11.25 off trucks delivered. Grace A drew \$1 per hog premium with discounts on off grades. Sows were \$7 to \$8 and odd young sows up to \$6.50 live weight.

NEW YORK, July 2—(AP)—The stock market unburdened itself of some war worries today and captured a part of the losses yielded in the slow decline of last week.

Recovery, although held to modest limits, brought a sizable list of gains in such groups as steels, rails, farm implements, chemicals and industrial specialties.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose 2 of a point to 41.7. Transfers totaled 394,949 shares.

Best prices were staged a little by some final hour profit taking. Up fractions to around a point at the finish were U.S. Steel, Youngstown Sheet & Iron, Du Pont, Union Carbide, Case, International Harvester, Santa Fe, New York Central and Pennsylvania.

Standard Oil (N.J.), Pepsi-Cola and Commonwealth and Southern pfd reached new 1941 highs. The last named soared 5 points on announcement of plans for its reorganization under the company's corporate simplification program.
