MONTREAL TO GODMOTHER RUINED AVION

MONTREAL, April 26—In order to aid in the movement for the relief of a town in France which is in a state of ruin as a result of the war, the city council has adopted a resolution by which Montreal will assume the role of "Godmother" for Avion, near Lens.
The Avion prior to the war had a population of 12,000 and 7,000 are now living there in the ruins, huts and cellars, under sanitary conditions that have produced an alarming rate of mortality. Practically every Montreal battalion fought in front of and in Avion and it was taken and held in 1917 by the Canadian corps.

Farewell to Father Gaudet

On the eve of his departure from Hope River, Rev. Father Gaudet was waited on by the members of the congregation, and presented with an address and purse. The address was read by Mr. J. Leeming Murphy and the presentation made by Mr. W. H. Hogan. Following is the address:—

Rev. J. A. Gaudet,

Rev. Dear Father:— It was certainly with heartfelt sorrow we learned that the relations that existed between us as pastor and people was about to be severed.

A little more than eight years ago you came here as our pastor, and during that time, by the faithful discharge of the duties confided to your care, you have, in an unprecedented manner, endeared yourself to us all. Always prompt to the call of duty, you were ever ready to bring consolation to the sick and afflicted, never tiring in your works of pastoral zeal. You were always ready and willing to assist those in distress, while your words of wise counsel, directed to us all, are among some of the good works accomplished during your pastorate the memory of which will long remain in our memories. We are aware that obedience to Episcopal authority is the sole reason of your departure from amongst us and we are soled by the thought that, if left to your own will, you would willingly remain with us.

In conclusion we have to express the wish, that you may be spared many years to labor in the Holy Ministry, and, while we pray that every blessing may attend you in your new field of labor, we humbly ask that in offering up the Holy Sacrifice you would sometimes remember your former flock in this parish. Please accept the accompanying gift, not for its material worth, but as an outward expression of the inward feeling of love, veneration and esteem which we entertain towards you.

ON BEHALF OF THE PEOPLE OF HOPE RIVER

Father Gaudet in reply thanked the people for their expression of good will. He expressed the sorrow he felt at parting with them, thanked them for the many acts of kindness he received at their hands and bespoke the same for his successor. In conclusion he wished that all blessings both spiritual and temporal might attend them.
